## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for retail
- 3 theft dispositions for minors.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 9729.1. Retail theft dispositions for minors.
- 9 (a) General rule.--In a prosecution under 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 10 3929(b)(1)(i) or (iii) (relating to retail theft), the court
- 11 may, in lieu of further proceedings, permit an eligible offender
- 12 to complete a program on values education approved by the court
- 13 of common pleas in the judicial district. An eligible offender
- 14 shall not be required to plead quilty or no contest to be
- 15 <u>accepted into the program.</u>
- 16 (b) Effect.--Acceptance into a values program under
- 17 subsection (a) shall be considered a first offense for purposes
- 18 of grading subsequent offenses under 18 Pa.C.S. § 3929(b).

- 1 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the term
- "eligible offender" means an offender who:
- 3 (1) is under 16 years of age; and
- (2) has not previously received disposition under this 4
- 5 section.
- Section 2. The addition of 42 Pa.C.S. § 9729.1 shall apply 6
- to prosecutions initiated on or after the effective date of this
- 8 act.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 9
