1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for the retention of records and for loans of certain equipment relating to nonpublic school children; and providing for access to personnel files by boards of school directors; AND RENAMING THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE SCHOOL OF TECHNOLOGY TO THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY.
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. Section 518 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
14	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended June
15	17, 1982 (P.L.525, No.149), is amended to read:
16	Section 518. Retention of RecordsEvery board of school
17	directors shall retain as a permanent record of the district,
18	the minute book, each annual auditor's report, and each annual
19	financial report. All other financial records of the district,
20	including financial account books, orders, bills, contracts,

invoices, receipts, and purchase orders shall be retained by the

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1 district for a period of not less than six years. Records may be 2 retained as [photographed, microphotographed or microfilmed 3 copies] recorded or copied in accordance with the act of January 4 18, 1968 (1967 P.L.961, No.428), known as the "Municipal Records 5 Act."

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
<u>Section 528. Access to Personnel Files.--The board of school</u>
<u>directors shall at all times have right of access to the</u>
<u>personnel files of all school district employes.</u>

Section 3. The definitions of "instructional equipment" and "textbooks" in section 923-A(b) of the act, amended or added July 12, 1972 (P.L.863, No.195) and July 18, 1974 (P.L.475, No.169), are amended to read:

14 Section 923-A. Loan of Textbooks, Instructional Materials 15 and Equipment, Nonpublic School Children.--* * *

16 (b) Definitions. The following terms, whenever used or 17 referred to in this section, shall have the following meanings, 18 except in those circumstances where the context clearly 19 indicates otherwise:

20 "Instructional equipment" means instructional equipment, 21 other than fixtures annexed to and forming part of the real 22 estate, which is suitable for and to be used by children and/or teachers. The term includes but is not limited to projection 23 24 equipment, recording equipment, satellite dishes and all 25 essential components for the reception and telecast of satellite 26 transmission, laboratory equipment, and any other educational 27 secular, neutral, non-ideological equipment as may be of benefit to the instruction of nonpublic school children and are 28 29 presently or hereafter provided for public school children of 30 the Commonwealth.

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"Textbooks" means books, workbooks, including reusable and 2 3 non-reusable workbooks, satellite dishes and all essential 4 components for the reception and telecast of satellite 5 transmission, and manuals, whether bound or in looseleaf form, intended for use as a principal source of study material for a 6 7 given class or group of students, a copy of which is expected to 8 be available for the individual use of each pupil in such class 9 or group. Such textbooks shall be textbooks which are acceptable 10 for use in any public, elementary, or secondary school of the 11 Commonwealth. * * * 12

13 SECTION 4. SECTIONS 1902-B, 1903-B, 1904-B, 1906-B, 1907-B,
14 1910-B, 1911-B, 1912-B AND 1913-B OF THE ACT, ADDED DECEMBER 19,
15 1990 (P.L.1362, NO.211), ARE AMENDED TO READ:

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16 SECTION 1902-B. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.--IT IS THE INTENT OF THE 17 GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE,

18 OPERATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE

19 [SCHOOL] <u>COLLEGE</u> OF TECHNOLOGY.

20 SECTION 1903-B. AUTHORIZATION TO CONTINUE SCHOOL

OPERATIONS.--THE INSTITUTION KNOWN AS THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE 21 22 [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY, ESTABLISHED AND OPERATED 23 PURSUANT TO THE REPEALED PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF MAY 11, 1905 (P.L.518, NO.429), IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO CONTINUE OPERATIONS 24 25 AND TO RECEIVE ANY STATE FUNDS OR AID TO WHICH IT MAY BE 26 ENTITLED. ALL LAWFUL ACTIONS AND EXPENDITURES MADE BY SAID 27 INSTITUTION BETWEEN OCTOBER 4, 1978, AND THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF 28 THIS ACT ARE HEREBY RATIFIED AND APPROVED BY THE GENERAL 29 ASSEMBLY.

30 SECTION 1904-B. SCHOOL PURPOSES.--(A) THE THADDEUS STEVENS 19930H1245B3816 - 3 - STATE [SCHOOL] <u>COLLEGE</u> OF TECHNOLOGY, LOCATED IN LANCASTER,
 PENNSYLVANIA, SHALL CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOR THE POSTSECONDARY
 EDUCATION AND TRAINING OF INDIGENT ORPHANS.

4 (B) IF A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF INDIGENT ORPHANS QUALIFIED FOR
5 ADMISSION PURSUANT TO SCHOOL STANDARDS FAIL TO APPLY, THEN THE
6 BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THIS CORPORATION MAY ADMIT FIRST OTHER
7 DESERVING PERSONS AND, THEREAFTER, ORPHANS WHO MAY NOT BE
8 INDIGENT, AS THE TRUSTEES IN THEIR BEST JUDGMENT MAY THINK
9 PROPER.

10 (C) THOSE SHALL BE DEEMED ORPHANS WHO HAVE LOST EITHER 11 PARENT.

12 SECTION 1906-B. BOARD OF TRUSTEES.--THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES 13 SHALL CONSIST OF NINE MEMBERS, WHO SHALL SERVE WITHOUT 14 COMPENSATION AND BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR BY AND WITH THE 15 ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE. SAID TRUSTEES SHALL BE A BODY 16 POLITIC OR CORPORATE OF THE NAME OF THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE 17 [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY. THEY SHALL, UNDER SECTION 1311 18 OF THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), KNOWN AS "THE 19 ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF 1929," HAVE GENERAL DIRECTION AND CONTROL 20 OF THE PROPERTY AND MANAGEMENT OF THE INSTITUTION, DEVELOP BROAD 21 INSTITUTIONAL POLICY AND MAKE ALL NECESSARY BYLAWS AND 22 REGULATIONS, NOT INCONSISTENT WITH EITHER THE PROVISIONS OF THE 23 CONSTITUTION, LAWS OF THE COMMONWEALTH OR RULES AND REGULATIONS 24 OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. OF THE TRUSTEES FIRST 25 APPOINTED, THREE SHALL SERVE FOR ONE YEAR, THREE FOR TWO YEARS 26 AND THREE FOR THREE YEARS, AND, AT THE EXPIRATION OF THE 27 RESPECTIVE PERIODS, THE VACANCIES SHALL BE FILLED BY THE 28 GOVERNOR, BY APPOINTMENT, FOR THREE YEARS, AS HEREINBEFORE 29 PROVIDED; AND, SHOULD ANY VACANCY OCCUR BY DEATH OR RESIGNATION 30 OR OTHERWISE OF ANY TRUSTEE, SUCH VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED, BY 19930H1245B3816 - 4 -

APPOINTMENT AS AFORESAID, FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF SAID
 TRUSTEE. THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION SHALL BE EX OFFICIO MEMBER
 OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

SECTION 1907-B. PRESIDENT OF SCHOOL.--THE CHIEF
ADMINISTRATOR AND ACADEMIC OFFICER OF THE THADDEUS STEVENS STATE
[SCHOOL] <u>COLLEGE</u> OF TECHNOLOGY SHALL BE THE PRESIDENT WHOSE
DUTIES SHALL BE DEFINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND APPROVED BY
THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION.

9 SECTION 1910-B. RIGHTS OF FACULTY AND STAFF.--EXCEPT AS 10 OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, FACULTY EMPLOYED IN THE THADDEUS 11 STEVENS STATE [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY SHALL CONTINUE TO ENJOY THE SAME RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES AS PROVIDED ON JUNE 30, 12 13 1990. NOTHING CONTAINED HEREIN SHALL SUPERSEDE OR PREEMPT ANY 14 PROVISIONS OF A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT NEGOTIATED 15 BETWEEN THE COMMONWEALTH AND AN EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE 16 EMPLOYES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACT OF JULY 23, 1970 (P.L.563, 17 NO.195), KNOWN AS THE "PUBLIC EMPLOYE RELATIONS ACT." IN NO 18 EVENT SHALL THE FACULTY BE CONSIDERED TO BE IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE, AS DEFINED BY THE ACT OF AUGUST 5, 1941 (P.L.752, 19 20 NO.286), KNOWN AS THE "CIVIL SERVICE ACT."

SECTION 1911-B. VISITATION PRIVILEGES.--THE GOVERNOR, 21 22 SECRETARY OF EDUCATION, JUDGES OF THE SEVERAL COURTS OF THE 23 COMMONWEALTH AND SENATORS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GENERAL 24 ASSEMBLY SHALL BE EX OFFICIO VISITORS OF SAID INSTITUTION, AND 25 IT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO INSPECTION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF 26 EDUCATION, AND AN ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CONDUCT AND MANAGEMENT OF 27 THE SCHOOL SHALL BE MADE BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE THADDEUS 28 STEVENS STATE [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY TO THE GENERAL 29 ASSEMBLY AND THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION.

30 SECTION 1912-B. PRIOR REFERENCES.--WHENEVER, IN ANY LAW, 19930H1245B3816 - 5 - REFERENCE IS MADE TO THE THADDEUS STEVENS INDUSTRIAL AND REFORM
 SCHOOL OF PENNSYLVANIA OR THE THADDEUS STEVENS TRADE SCHOOL, IT
 SHALL BE DEEMED TO REFER TO AND INCLUDE THE THADDEUS STEVENS
 STATE [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY.

5 SECTION 1913-B. ACQUISITION AND DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY.--THE TRUSTEES OF THADDEUS STEVENS STATE [SCHOOL] COLLEGE OF 6 TECHNOLOGY SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO ACQUIRE AND RETAIN ANY 7 PROPERTY, REAL, PERSONAL OR MIXED, TANGIBLE OR INTANGIBLE, 8 9 NECESSARY OR DESIRABLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE SCHOOL, AND TO SELL, TRANSFER AND DISPOSE OF ANY PROPERTY, REAL, 10 11 PERSONAL OR MIXED, TANGIBLE OR INTANGIBLE, OR ANY INTEREST THEREIN AT ANY TIME ACQUIRED BY IT AND TO TAKE, DEMAND, RECEIVE 12 13 AND POSSESS ALL MONEYS, REAL PROPERTY AND GOODS WHICH SHALL BE 14 APPROPRIATED, GIVEN OR GRANTED TO AND FOR THE USE OF THE SCHOOL 15 AND TO APPLY THE SAME ACCORDING TO THE WILL OF THE DONORS; AND, 16 BY GIFT, PURCHASE OR DEVISE, TO RECEIVE, POSSESS, ENJOY AND 17 RETAIN FOREVER ANY AND ALL REAL AND PERSONAL ESTATE AND FUNDS, 18 OF WHATSOEVER KIND, NATURE OR QUALITY THE SAME MAY BE, IN 19 SPECIAL TRUST AND CONFIDENCE THAT THE SAME, AND THE PROFITS 20 THEREOF, SHALL BE APPLIED TO AND FOR THE USE AND PURPOSE OF 21 ENDOWING THE SCHOOL, AND SHALL HAVE POWER TO RECEIVE DONATIONS 22 FROM ANY SOURCE WHATEVER, TO BE EXCLUSIVELY DEVOTED TO THE 23 PURPOSES OF THE SCHOOL OR ACCORDING TO THE TERMS OF DONATION. 24 Section 4 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
