## AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 2 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 4 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," providing special occasion permits for fraternal benefit 17 18 societies.
- 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 Section 1. Section 102 of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90,
- 22 No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended June 29,
- 23 1987 (P.L.32, No.14), is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 24 Section 102. Definitions. -- The following words or phrases,

- 2 meanings ascribed to them in this section:

- 4 <u>"Fraternal benefit society" shall mean a society as defined</u>
- 5 in the act of December 14, 1992 (P.L.835, No.134), known as the
- 6 "Fraternal Benefit Societies Code."

- 8 Section 2. Section 408.4(a) of the act is amended to read:
- 9 Section 408.4. Special Occasion Permits.--(a) Upon
- 10 application of any hospital, church, synagogue, volunteer fire
- 11 company, volunteer ambulance company, volunteer rescue squad,
- 12 bona fide sportsmen's club in existence for at least ten years,
- 13 <u>fraternal benefit society that is licensed to do business in</u>
- 14 this Commonwealth and any affiliated lodge or subdivision of
- 15 <u>such fraternal benefit society</u>, or the auxiliary of any of the
- 16 foregoing, and upon payment of a fee of [fifteen dollars (\$15)]
- 17 per day, ] EIGHTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$85) FOR THE FIRST DAY AND THIRTY <-
- 18 DOLLARS (\$30) FOR EACH ADDITIONAL DAY PURSUANT TO SECTION 614-A
- 19 OF THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), KNOWN AS "THE
- 20 <u>ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF 1929,"</u> the board shall issue a special
- 21 occasion permit good for a period of not more than five
- 22 consecutive or nonconsecutive days: Provided, however, That the
- 23 five nonconsecutive days shall be used in a three-month period
- 24 measured from the date of the first day. Special occasion
- 25 permits may also be issued to a museum operated by a nonprofit
- 26 corporation in a city of the third class or a nonprofit
- 27 corporation engaged in the performing arts in a city of the
- 28 third class for a period of not more than six nonconsecutive or
- 29 ten consecutive days at a fee of [fifteen dollars (\$15)] THIRTY
- 30 DOLLARS (\$30) per day.

- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
