## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; providing for the licensing of nurses and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses, subject to appeal, and for their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such licenses; regulating nursing in general; prescribing penalties and repealing certain laws," further providing for refusal, suspension or revocation of licenses.

- 4 <u>UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT SHALL INCLUDE</u>

- 6 STANDARD OF THE PROFESSION. THE ETHICAL AND QUALITY STANDARDS OF
