4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

7 ~~This act shall be known and may be cited as the Game Fund~~

10 ~~The total authorization for the capital projects in the~~

~~The individual capital projects in the category of public improvement projects to be acquired by the Pennsylvania Game Commission, and to be financed from current revenues of the Game Fund pursuant to executive authorizations, are hereby itemized, together with their respective estimated costs, as follows:~~

~~(i) Land acquisition 750 acres \$188,000~~

~~(2) Mifflin County~~

~~(i) Land acquisition 564 acres 367,000~~

~~Section 4. Effective date.~~

~~This act shall take effect immediately.~~

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE AND CONSTRUCTION.

(A) SHORT TITLE.--THIS ACT SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY BE CITED AS THE CAPITAL BUDGET ACT OF 1994-1995.

(B) SUPPLEMENTS.--A REFERENCE TO THIS ACT SHALL BE DEEMED TO INCLUDE A REFERENCE TO THE SUPPLEMENTS TO THIS ACT.

(C) FISCAL CODE.--THE PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS OF ARTICLE XVI-B OF THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.343, NO.176), KNOWN AS THE FISCAL CODE, SHALL APPLY TO THIS ACT TO THE EXTENT THEY ARE NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ACT.

SECTION 2. OVERALL LIMITATIONS ON DEBT TO BE INCURRED FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS.

THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ADDITIONAL DEBT TO BE INCURRED DURING THE 1994-1995 FISCAL YEAR, AND THEREAFTER UNTIL THE ENACTMENT OF THE 1995-1996 CAPITAL BUDGET SPECIFYING THE MAXIMUM DEBT FOR THE 1995-1996 FISCAL YEAR, FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS SPECIFICALLY ITEMIZED IN A CAPITAL BUDGET PURSUANT TO SECTION 7(A)(4) OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA, AND THE FUND TO BE CHARGED WITH THE REPAYMENT OF SUCH DEBT, SHALL, WITH RESPECT TO EACH CATEGORY OF CAPITAL PROJECTS, BE AS
