AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for obstructing emergency 3 services. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 5 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 5112. Obstructing emergency services. 9 (a) Offense defined. --(1) A person commits a summary offense if he, through 10 his intentional action, impedes, obstructs or interferes with 11 emergency services personnel performing a rescue, providing 12 emergency medical services to an injured victim or performing 13 14 firefighting activities. (2) A person commits a misdemeanor of the third degree 15

if he enters a secured emergency zone without first obtaining

permission from the official in charge of the emergency

- 1 services personnel which established the zone.
- 2 (b) Emergency zones. -- Emergency services personnel are
- 3 <u>authorized to established secured emergency zones in order to</u>
- 4 <u>insure the efficient rendering of the services being provided.</u>
- 5 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 6 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 7 subsection:
- 8 <u>"Emergency medical services." The services utilized in</u>
- 9 responding to the needs of an individual for immediate medical
- 10 care in order to prevent loss of life or the aggravation of
- 11 physiological or psychological illness or injury.
- 12 <u>"Emergency services personnel." Police, firefighters,</u>
- 13 <u>licensed physicians, registered nurses, emergency medical</u>
- 14 technicians and technician-paramedics and first responders.
- 15 <u>"Rescue." The act of extricating persons from entrapment or</u>
- 16 dangerous situations which pose the imminent threat of death or
- 17 serious bodily injury.
- 18 "Secured emergency zone." A clearly designated area
- 19 surrounding victims in need of rescue or emergency medical
- 20 <u>services</u>. The term shall also include the area surrounding a
- 21 fire.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
