A RESOLUTION

1 Designating October 23 through 31, 1993, as "Red Ribbon Week."

2 WHEREAS, Alcohol and other drug use in this nation continues
3 in epidemic proportions, and those in the 15 to 24 year-old age
4 group are dying at a faster rate than those of other ages; and

5 WHEREAS, It is imperative that visible, unified prevention
6 education efforts by community members be launched to reduce the
7 demand for drugs; and

8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians AWARE and the Pennsylvania's Attorney
9 General's Office are sponsoring the Red Ribbon Campaign offering
10 citizens of Pennsylvania the opportunity to demonstrate their
11 commitment to a drug-free lifestyle; and

12 WHEREAS, The Red Ribbon Campaign will be celebrated in every

1 community during "Red Ribbon Week," October 23 through 31, 1993;
2 and

3 WHEREAS, Business, government, law enforcement, schools,
4 religious institutions, service organizations, youth,
5 physicians, senior citizens, military, sports teams, and
6 individuals will demonstrate their commitment to drug-free,
7 healthy lifestyles by wearing and displaying red ribbons during
8 this week-long campaign; therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives proclaim October
10 23 through 31, 1993, as "Red Ribbon Week," and encourages all
11 citizens to participate in drug education and prevention
12 activities to make a visible show of support for our strong
13 commitment to a drug-free community.
