## AN ACT

Placing a moratorium on the construction of contaminated soil 2 incinerators; and directing the Conservation Committee of the 3 House of Representatives to study the effects of contaminated 4 soil incinerators on public health, the environment and the 5 economy. 6 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows: That incineration is a waste-processing method that 8 should be used only as an option of last resort for the 9 processing of contaminated waste for ultimate disposal. 10 (2)That the renewed interest in underground storage 11 tank cleanup will result in a great deal of contaminated soil 12 in the future and that State officials should carefully 13 examine other waste disposal options, including, but not limited to, bio-remediation or land farming, before 14 15 permitting contaminated soil incinerators. 16 That the possible adverse effects to public health,

constructing and operating contaminated soil incinerators

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- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. Short title.
- 4 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Contaminated
- 5 Soil Incinerator Moratorium Act.
- 6 Section 2. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 8 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Contaminated soil incinerator." An enclosed device using
- 11 controlled flame combustion, the primary purpose of which is to
- 12 thermally break down and purify soil contaminated with petroleum
- 13 products.
- 14 "Department." The Department of Environmental Resources of
- 15 the Commonwealth.
- 16 Section 3. Moratorium on construction of contaminated soil
- incinerators.
- 18 The department is directed to immediately cease reviewing
- 19 applications or issuing new permits for new contaminated soil
- 20 incinerators for a period of 24 months.
- 21 Section 4. Powers and duties.
- 22 The Conservation Committee of the House of Representatives
- 23 shall have, in addition to its other powers and duties, the
- 24 power and its duties shall be:
- 25 (1) To study and evaluate the methods of contaminated
- soil incineration or any other alternative to incineration.
- 27 (2) To evaluate the effects, if any, that contaminated
- 28 soil incineration has on the public health, the environment
- and the economy.
- 30 (3) To evaluate current safety standards and to propose

- any additional standards necessary to insure that the public
- 2 health is not adversely affected by contaminated soil
- 3 incineration.
- 4 (4) To report its findings and recommendations to the
- 5 Governor, the General Assembly and the department as soon as
- 6 possible and to make a final report on its findings and
- 7 recommendations within 24 months.
- 8 Section 5. Effective date.
- 9 This act shall take effect as follows:
- 10 (1) Section 3 and this section shall take effect
- immediately.
- 12 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- days.
