AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, requiring the presence of
- parents, guardians or custodians at proceedings involving
- 4 juveniles.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 6310. Parental or legal guardian attendance required at
- 10 <u>juvenile proceedings.</u>
- 11 (a) Order to attend. -- In any proceedings under this chapter,
- 12 a court shall issue an order specifically requiring the parent
- 13 or legal quardian or person with whom the child resides, if
- 14 other than the parent or quardian, to be present and ready to
- 15 participate in the proceedings with the juvenile. No later than
- 16 30 days before such proceedings, the court shall send a notice

- 1 of the order to the parent or legal quardian or person with whom
- 2 the child resides if other than the parent or quardian.
- 3 (b) Contempt. -- A person failing to comply with an order of
- 4 participation may be found in contempt of court as outlined in
- 5 sections 4132 (relating to attachment and summary punishment for
- 6 contempts) and 4133 (relating to commitment or fine for
- 7 <u>contempt</u>).
- 8 (c) Bench warrant.--The court shall issue a bench warrant
- 9 for any parent or guardian or person with whom the child
- 10 resides, if other than the parent or quardian, who fails to
- 11 appear at any proceedings. The court may waive any fine or other
- 12 punishment if the person is found to be present and ready to
- 13 participate in the proceedings with the juvenile after a bench
- 14 warrant is issued.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
