AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
 Consolidated Statutes, providing for the possession or
 transportation of certain firearms by minors; and providing
 penalties.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:

 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 6106.2. Possession or transportation of certain firearms by
- minors.
- 11 (a) General rule.--It shall be unlawful for any person under
- 12 18 years of age to knowingly and intentionally possess or
- 13 transport a handqun or assault firearm anywhere in this
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 (b) Penalty.--A violation of subsection (a) constitutes a
- 16 misdemeanor of the first degree.
- 17 (c) Forfeiture. -- Any firearm possessed or transported in
- 18 violation of this section shall be forfeited to the Commonwealth

- 1 and disposed of as provided by law.
- 2 (d) Exceptions. -- This section shall not apply to any of the
- 3 <u>following:</u>
- 4 <u>(1) A person:</u>
- 5 <u>(i) while in his home or on his property;</u>
- 6 (ii) while in the home or on the property of his
- 7 parent, grandparent or legal guardian; or
- 8 (iii) while on the property of another who has
- 9 <u>provided prior permission and with the prior permission</u>
- of his parent or legal quardian if the person has the
- 11 <u>landowner's written permission on his person while on</u>
- 12 <u>that property.</u>
- 13 (2) A person who, while accompanied by an adult, is at
- or going to and from a lawful shooting range or firearms
- 15 <u>educational class, provided that the weapons are unloaded</u>
- while being transported.
- 17 (3) A person actually engaged in lawful hunting or going
- 18 to and from a hunting area or preserve, provided that the
- 19 weapons are unloaded while being transported.
- 20 (4) A person while carrying out his duties in the armed
- 21 <u>forces of the United States, the Pennsylvania National Guard</u>
- 22 or the National Guard of any other state.
- 23 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 24 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 25 subsection:
- 26 "Assault firearm." Any of the following:
- 27 (1) A semiautomatic center fire rifle or pistol which
- 28 <u>expels a projectile by action of an explosion and is equipped</u>
- 29 at the time of the offense with a magazine which will hold
- 30 more than 20 rounds of ammunition or designed by the

- 1 manufacturer to accommodate a silencer or equipped with a
- 2 <u>folding stock.</u>
- 3 (2) A shotgun with a magazine which will hold more than
- 4 seven rounds of the longest ammunition for which it is
- 5 <u>chambered</u>.
- 6 <u>"Handgun." A pistol or revolver or other firearm originally</u>
- 7 designed, made and intended to fire a projectile by means of an
- 8 explosion from one or more barrels when held in one hand.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
