AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 9, 1990 (P.L.340, No.78), entitled "An act providing for a Statewide emergency telephone number 911 system; providing for contributions from telephone subscribers; providing a penalty; and making a repeal," providing additional powers and duties to counties relating to the naming and numbering of streets within third class cities, boroughs and townships.

- 9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. Section 4(a) of the act of July 9, 1990 (P.L.340,

11 No.78), known as the Public Safety Emergency Telephone Act, is

12 amended by adding a paragraph to read:

13 Section 4. Counties.

14 (a) Powers and duties.--The board of county commissioners,

15 or, in a home rule county, the appropriate body according to the

16 home rule charter, shall have the following powers and duties in

17 relation to a 911 system:

1	(6) To direct the governing body of each city of the	
2	third class, borough, incorporated town, township or home	
3	rule municipality to name each street and number each	
4	building on such street within each municipality in order to	
5	foster fast and efficient response of emergency vehicles. If	
6	any such municipality refuses to comply with the direction of	
7	the county within ONE YEAR OF THE DATE OF SUBMISSION OF THE	<—
8	COUNTY PLAN TO THE DEPARTMENT OR WITHIN a period of one year	
9	from the effective date of this paragraph, WHICHEVER IS	<
10	LATER, then the county, as part of the county plan under	
11	section 5, shall name each street and number each building.
