## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581),
- 2 entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending
- and consolidating the law relating to boroughs, "further
- 4 providing for the naming of streets and the numbering of
- 5 buildings.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 1202(25) of the act of February 1, 1966
- 9 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), known as The Borough Code, is amended
- 10 to read:
- 11 Section 1202. Specific Powers.--The powers of the borough
- 12 shall be vested in the corporate authorities. Among the specific
- 13 powers of the borough shall be the following, and in the
- 14 exercise of any of such powers involving the enactment of any
- 15 ordinance or the making of any regulation, restriction or
- 16 prohibition, the borough may provide for the enforcement thereof
- 17 and may prescribe penalties for the violation thereof or for the
- 18 failure to conform thereto:

- 2 (25) [Numbering buildings. To require and regulate the
- 3 numbering of buildings.] Naming of streets; numbering of
- 4 buildings. To provide for and regulate the naming of streets,
- 5 roads and highways, and to require and regulate the numbering of
- 6 <u>buildings</u>. In order to assist emergency vehicles in providing
- 7 <u>efficient service and to provide for the rapid and correct</u>
- 8 identification of borough residents, the provisions of this
- 9 <u>clause are mandatory and shall be complied with no later than</u>
- 10 <u>January 1, 1997.</u>

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
