## REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON AGING AND YOUTH, APRIL 27, 1995

## AN ACT

- 1 Providing permanence for children with special needs through 2 adoption.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Legislative findings and purpose.
- 6 (a) Findings.--
- 7 (1) The General Assembly finds that several thousand 8 children with special needs who have a goal of adoption under
- 9 the supervision of government are being denied the security
- of a permanent family.
- 11 (2) There is a lack of urgency surrounding adoption
- 12 services for children with special needs forcing them to
- 13 languish in foster care despite the commitment of many
- 14 Commonwealth families who are willing to provide them
- 15 permanence through adoption.
- 16 (3) Once a goal of adoption has been established for

- 1 children with special needs, two years and eight months is
- 2 the median length of time that these children wait to be
- 3 adopted.
- 4 (4) The county children and youth system is overwhelmed
- 5 by child abuse and neglect cases and cannot give proper
- 6 attention to the attainment of permanency through adoption
- 7 services for children with special needs.
- 8 (5) There is lack of uniformity among counties in the
- 9 provision of permanency through adoption services.
- 10 (6) Parts of this Commonwealth do not have access to
- 11 adoption services.
- 12 (7) County boundaries create barriers to equitable
- access to special needs adoption and subsidies.
- 14 (8) The number of trained adoption staff is inadequate
- to guarantee that children with special needs will achieve
- 16 permanence through adoption in a timely manner.
- 17 (b) Purpose.--It is the purpose of this act to provide the
- 18 necessary resources for special needs children so that they will
- 19 be provided the security of a permanent family through adoption
- 20 regardless of where they live in this Commonwealth. Further, the
- 21 purpose of this act is to reduce system barriers which prevent
- 22 equal access to appropriate services to both special needs
- 23 children needing adoptive families and residents of this
- 24 Commonwealth who are interested in adopting special needs
- 25 children.
- 26 Section 2. Definitions.
- 27 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 28 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 29 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 30 "Adoption services." Services which shall include, without

- 1 limitation, the following:
- 2 (1) Targeted family recruitment.
- 3 (2) Adoptive family assessment, preparation and
- 4 education.
- 5 (3) Comprehensive child assessment.
- 6 (4) Legal services.
- 7 (5) Adoption subsidies.
- 8 (6) Family and child preplacement and placement.
- 9 (7) Postplacement services.
- 10 (8) Postfinalization services.
- 11 (9) Information and referral.
- 12 "Advisory committee." A committee appointed by the Secretary
- 13 of Public Welfare, composed of at least ten, but no more than 15
- 14 members. The secretary shall serve as the chairperson of the
- 15 committee. The following individuals shall be appointed to the
- 16 committee:
- 17 (1) The chairman of the Aging and Youth Committee of the
- 18 Senate.
- 19 (2) The chairman of the Aging and Youth Committee of the
- 20 House of Representatives.
- 21 (3) The minority chairman of the Aging and Youth
- 22 Committee of the Senate.
- 23 (4) The minority chairman of the Aging and Youth
- 24 Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 25 (5) A representative from the county children and youth
- 26 administrators.
- 27 (6) A representative from the juvenile court system.
- 28 (7) A representative from the orphans' court system.
- 29 (8) A representative from a Statewide association for
- 30 private providers.

- "Child assessment." Child-centered individualized
- 2 compilation within a holistic context of a child's comprehensive
- 3 life experiences.
- 4 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 "Full disclosure." The provision of information of record to
- 7 adoptive parents about the child with special needs, which will
- 8 allow adoptive parents to make an informed decision concerning
- 9 their ability to parent.
- "Request for proposal" or "RFP." A form which shall be
- 11 submitted by potential contractors for selection of the
- 12 Statewide system manager.
- "Special needs child." A child who has one or more of the
- 14 following characteristics:
- 15 (1) Has a documented physical, mental or emotional
- 16 handicap or is at risk of developing a physical, mental or
- 17 emotional handicap.
- 18 (2) Is a member of a minority ethnic or racial group.
- 19 (3) Is a member of a sibling group needing to be placed
- together with the same family.
- 21 (4) Is five years of age or older.
- 22 (5) Has been sexually or physically abused.
- 23 (6) Has experienced multiple placements.
- 24 (7) Has been in out-of-home placement more than 18
- 25 months.
- 26 "Statewide system manager." A Commonwealth private nonprofit
- 27 Statewide organization under contract with the Department of
- 28 Public Welfare which is responsible for the day-to-day operation
- 29 of the special needs adoption system.
- 30 Section 3. Duties of department.

- 1 (a) Development of plan. -- Within 30 days of the effective
- 2 date of this act, an advisory committee appointed by the
- 3 Secretary of Public Welfare shall develop a Statewide permanency
- 4 planning and adoption plan setting forth goals.
- 5 (b) Issuance of RFP.--Within 30 days of the adoption of the
- 6 plan by the advisory committee, the department shall issue an
- 7 RFP consistent with this act and the developed goals to identify
- 8 a Statewide system manager.
- 9 (c) Statewide system manager.--The department shall contract
- 10 with a Statewide system manager to provide a special needs
- 11 adoption system within 90 calendar days of the issuance of the
- 12 RFP. The Statewide system manager shall be selected from
- 13 Commonwealth private nonprofit applicants who shall submit a
- 14 three-year proposal in which the applicant established its
- 15 ability, through prior experience in the delivery of children-
- 16 related and youth-related services and contract management in
- 17 this Commonwealth, to:
- 18 (1) Make available the full range of adoption services
- 19 to all publicly funded children with special needs who have
- 20 been accepted for service by the county children and youth
- agencies and have a goal of adoption.
- 22 (2) Initiate cooperative arrangements with county
- children and youth agencies.
- 24 (3) Establish cooperative arrangements with existing
- 25 Federal, State and local adoption services and registries.
- 26 (4) Establish and operate a systemwide child and
- 27 adoptive parent-specific data system which incorporates
- 28 child-specific outcomes.
- 29 (5) Assume the duties of the Pennsylvania Adoption
- 30 Exchange.

- 1 (d) Initial contract. -- The department shall award the
- 2 contract for the Statewide system manager within 180 calendar
- 3 days of the effective date of this act.
- 4 (e) Compliance. -- The department shall monitor the contract
- 5 for compliance.
- 6 (f) Annual report.--The department shall provide an annual
- 7 fiscal and program evaluation report to the General Assembly by
- 8 April of each year.
- 9 (g) Payment of adoption subsidies.--The department and
- 10 Statewide system manager shall establish a procedure for the
- 11 approval and payment of adoption subsidies in a timely and
- 12 uniform manner. This procedure shall then be administered by the
- 13 department in cooperation with the Statewide system manager. The
- 14 department and Statewide system manager also shall prepare and
- 15 implement a plan to transfer Federal and State adoption funding
- 16 and adoption subsidies from counties to the department to
- 17 finance the Statewide special needs adoption system and the
- 18 subsidized adopted special needs children.
- 19 (h) Regulations.--The department shall issue administrative
- 20 bulletins to aid in the implementation of this act. These
- 21 administrative bulletins shall be transmitted within 180 days of
- 22 the effective date of this act.
- 23 Section 4. Duties of counties.
- 24 (a) Referrals.--Within 60 days of the determination of the
- 25 goal of adoption, county children and youth agencies shall
- 26 register all special needs children, as defined in this act,
- 27 with the Statewide system manager for adoption services. The
- 28 determination shall have been made through an administrative or
- 29 judicial review.
- 30 (b) Prospective adoptive parents.--County children and youth

- 1 agencies shall register all persons interested in adopting a
- 2 child with special needs with the Statewide system manager.
- 3 (c) Adoption services. -- County children and youth agencies
- 4 may subcontract with the Statewide system manager to provide
- 5 adoption services.
- 6 (d) Access to information. -- County children and youth
- 7 agencies shall make available all information of record which
- 8 will contribute to full disclosure.
- 9 Section 5. Service provision.
- 10 (a) Development of special needs adoption system. -- The
- 11 Statewide system manager shall develop a Statewide special needs
- 12 adoption system for this Commonwealth which can meet the goals
- 13 set forth in the plan developed by the department and the
- 14 advisory committee appointed in accordance with section 3(a).
- 15 The Statewide system manager shall insure the availability of
- 16 needed services. Direct adoption services shall be made
- 17 available only through subcontracts. When a subcontractor is
- 18 used for the delivery of service, such services must be
- 19 contracted through an RFP process. Subcontracts may be issued on
- 20 a geographical basis, need not be coterminous with county
- 21 boundaries and may be systemwide or regionwide on a functional
- 22 basis. Subcontracting agencies shall meet any applicable
- 23 licensing or certification requirements of the appropriate State
- 24 or local governmental agency. Subcontracts shall be implemented
- 25 and monitored by the Statewide system manager.
- 26 (b) System to provide equal access.--A Statewide system of
- 27 special needs adoption shall be developed which provides equal
- 28 access to adoption services for all residents of this
- 29 Commonwealth.
- 30 (c) Adoptive parents to pay no costs.--Adoptive families

- 1 shall not be required to bear any costs for the services
- 2 provided by the Statewide special needs adoption system.
- 3 (d) Full disclosure of information. -- The Statewide system
- 4 manager will develop a procedure to ensure the full disclosure
- 5 of information to adoptive parents.
- 6 (e) Out-of-State contracts.--If, after review of
- 7 Commonwealth resources, no adoptive family is available, the
- 8 Statewide system manager may contract with an agency or agencies
- 9 from out-of-State to provide for adoption services. If an out-
- 10 of-State agency is used, it shall be licensed or certified by
- 11 the appropriate governmental agency in the state which it is
- 12 located.
- 13 Section 6. Duties of public and private agencies.
- 14 All licensed public and private adoption agencies shall
- 15 register all children with special needs with the Statewide
- 16 system manager and shall refer all individuals or families who
- 17 have successfully completed an adoption home study and are
- 18 interested in adopting a special needs child.
- 19 Section 7. Related agencies' activity.
- 20 This act shall not be construed to limit or delay actions by
- 21 agencies or institutions to arrange for adoptions or other
- 22 related matters on their own initiative.
- 23 Section 8. Appeals.
- 24 Appeals of actions of the Statewide system manager or any of
- 25 its subcontractors shall be filed in accordance with regulations
- 26 promulgated by the department.
- 27 Section 9. Applicability.
- 28 This act shall apply to all children who have been accepted
- 29 for services by a county children and youth agency on or after
- 30 the effective date of this act.

- 1 Section 10. Sunset provision.
- 2 This act shall expire ten years after its effective date
- 3 unless extended by the General Assembly.
- 4 Section 11. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect in 30 days.
