Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for defiant 3 trespasser. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 3503(b) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 7 § 3503. Criminal trespass. 8 9 10 (b) Defiant trespasser.--A person commits an offense if, knowing that he is 11 12 not licensed or privileged to do so, he enters or remains in 13 any place as to which notice against trespass is given by: (i) actual communication to the actor; or 14 15 (ii) posting in a manner prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders; 16 17 or 18 fencing or other enclosure manifestly designed

to exclude intruders. 1 (2) An offense under this subsection constitutes a 2 3 misdemeanor of the third degree if the offender defies an 4 order to leave personally communicated to him by the owner of 5 the premises or other authorized person.] (2) (i) An offense under paragraph (1)(i) constitutes a 6 7 misdemeanor of the second degree if the offender defies an order to leave personally communicated to him by the 8 9 owner of the premises or other authorized person. (ii) An offense under paragraph (1)(ii) constitutes 10 a misdemeanor of the third degree if the offender defies 11 an order to leave personally communicated to him by the 12 13 owner of the premises or other authorized person. (iii) An offense under paragraph (1)(iii) 14

- (3) A person commits a misdemeanor of the third degree if, knowing that he is not licensed or privileged to do so, he enters onto the property of another for the purpose of burning a cross for any reason.
