AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1986 (P.L.89, No.33), entitled "An 1 2 act amending the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), 3 entitled 'An act relating to the practice of psychology, providing for licensing of psychologists, making certain acts 4 5 illegal and providing penalties, ' reestablishing the State 6 Board of Psychologist Examiners as the State Board of Psychology; providing for its composition, powers and duties; 7 8 changing provisions relating to the issuance of licenses and the suspension and revocation of licenses; providing for 9 fees; providing for penalties; and making repeals," further 10 11 providing for delayed implementation.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Section 20 of the act of April 12, 1986 (P.L.89, 15 No.33), entitled "An act amending the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), entitled 'An act relating to the practice of 16 17 psychology, providing for licensing of psychologists, making certain acts illegal and providing penalties, ' reestablishing 18 19 the State Board of Psychologist Examiners as the State Board of 20 Psychology; providing for its composition, powers and duties; 21 changing provisions relating to the issuance of licenses and the 22 suspension and revocation of licenses; providing for fees;

providing for penalties; and making repeals," amended July 13,
 1988 (P.L.508, No.88), is amended to read:

3 Section 20. To provide a transition period for persons who 4 had completed or were enrolled in a graduate degree program in 5 psychology or another of the behavioral sciences as of September 6 30, 1986, to apply for licensure under rules in existence 7 immediately prior to the effective date of this act, the board, 8 until [December 31, 1995] <u>June 30, 1997</u>, shall issue initial 9 licenses to persons who:

(1) by December 31, [1994] <u>1996</u>, submitted evidence in a manner prescribed by the board of having, as of September 30, 12 1986, completed or been then currently enrolled in a graduate degree program in psychology or another of the behavioral sciences; [and]

15 (2) have completed three years of supervised experience 16 as a psychologist-in-training, 3,500 hours of which shall 17 have been supervised by a licensed psychologist in accordance 18 with the requirements of the board; [and]

19 (3) have fulfilled all administrative requirements of 20 the board as of [December 31, 1994] <u>January 31, 1995</u>, and 21 possessed all of the other qualifications for licensure in 22 effect at the time of the examination; and

23 (4) have satisfactorily passed the examination.
24 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
