AN ACT

Amending the act of October 21, 1988 (P.L.1036, No.116), 1 entitled "An act establishing the Hardwoods Development 2 3 Council; conferring powers and duties upon the council; and making an appropriation, " further providing for definitions, 4 5 for the Hardwoods Development Council and for the council's powers and duties; AND PROVIDING FOR A TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS 6 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 7 8 AGRICULTURE.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Sections 3, 4 and 6 of the act of October 21,

12 1988 (P.L.1036, No.116), known as the Hardwoods Development

13 Council Act, are amended to read:

14 Section 3. Definitions.

15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

17 context clearly indicates otherwise:

18 "Council." The Hardwoods Development Council of the

19 Commonwealth established under section 4.

1 "Department." The Department of [Commerce] <u>Agriculture</u> of the Commonwealth. 2 3 Section 4. Council. 4 (a) Composition. -- The Hardwoods Development Council is 5 established within the department. The council shall include, but not be limited to, the following [21] 24 members: 6 <----7 (1) [Four] <u>FIVE</u> members: <-----8 (i) The Secretary of Agriculture. (ii) The Secretary of Commerce. 9 10 (iii) The Secretary of [Environmental] Conservation 11 and Natural Resources. (iv) The State Forester. 12 13 (V) THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION. <----14 (2) Four legislative members: 15 (i) Two senators, one appointed by the President pro 16 tempore of the Senate and one appointed by the Minority 17 Leader of the Senate. 18 (ii) Two representatives, one appointed by the 19 Speaker of the House of Representatives and one appointed 20 by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. 21 (3) [Thirteen] <u>FIFTEEN</u> public members appointed by the <-----22 Governor: 23 (i) One representative of an agricultural college from a State-related university. 24 25 (ii) One representative of the Forest Service of the 26 Federal Department of Agriculture. 27 (iii) One representative of furniture manufacturers. 28 (iv) One representative of veneer manufacturers. 29 (v) Two representatives of secondary processors. 30 (vi) Two representatives of nonprofit corporations 19960H2380B3560 - 2 -

- 1 which have the purpose to promote and enhance the hardwood industry in this Commonwealth. 2 3 (vii) One representative of the Pennsylvania Chamber 4 of Business and Industry. 5 (viii) One representative of the Pennsylvania Forestry Association. 6 (ix) One representative of the Pennsylvania Hardwood 7 Lumber Manufacturing Association. 8 (x) One representative of pulp and paper 9 manufacturers. 10 11 (xi) One representative of the saw mill operators. 12 (XII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF MAPLE PRODUCERS. <-13 (XIII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE 14 ASSOCIATION OF TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS. (b) Term of office.--15 Members under subsection (a)(1) shall serve as long 16 (1)17 as they are in office. 18 (2) Legislative members under subsection (a)(2) shall 19 serve terms of two years. 20 (3) Public members under subsection (a)(3) shall serve the following terms: 21 22 (i) Public members under subsection (a)(3)(vi) 23 through (ix) AND (XII) shall serve terms of two years. <---24 (ii) Public members under subsection (a)(3)(iii) 25 through (v), (x) and (xi) shall serve terms of three 26 years. 27 (iii) Public members under subsection (a)(3)(i) and 28 (ii) shall serve terms of four years. (c) Designees.--Members under subsection (a)(1) and 29 30 legislative members under subsection (a)(2) may appoint

1 designees to serve on the council.

2 (d) Vacancies.--Vacancies in office shall be filled by the3 appointing authority who made the original appointment.

4 (e) Officers.--The Secretary of [Commerce] <u>Agriculture</u> or
5 his designee shall serve as the chairperson, and the council
6 shall elect other officers as it deems necessary.

7 (f) Meetings.--The council shall meet quarterly and shall 8 hold special meetings at the call of the chairperson. A simple 9 majority shall constitute a quorum.

10 (g) Compensation.--Members of the council shall serve 11 without compensation.

12 Section 6. Powers and duties of council.

13 The council has the following powers and duties:

14 (1) To recommend appropriate measures relating to the
15 promotion of the industrial potential of the hardwood
16 industry in this Commonwealth.

17 (2) To propose plans for economic development and18 expansion of the Commonwealth's hardwood industry.

19 (3) To develop a national and international marketing
20 program to promote Pennsylvania hardwoods as the world's
21 finest and to assist Pennsylvania's hardwood manufacturers
22 and processors in developing national and foreign markets.

(4) To encourage cooperation and coordination among
Federal, State and local programs. This paragraph includes
public-sector and private-sector programs. This paragraph
includes access to the data of administrative agencies unless
the access is prohibited by law.

(5) To recommend to the Governor, <u>THE SECRETARY OF</u> <--
 <u>AGRICULTURE</u>, the Secretary of [Commerce] <u>Agriculture</u> and the <--
 General Assembly the updating of economic delivery tools as

well as to develop research initiatives which would lead to
 the promotion of the hardwood industry in this Commonwealth.

3 (6) To maintain liaison with and advise the Governor, 4 THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE, the Secretary of {Commerce} 5 Agriculture and the General Assembly on programs and 6 projects, including, but not limited to, research, marketing 7 and promotion. These activities shall be carried out in 8 conjunction with the department and the appropriate nonprofit 9 organizations whose primary role is to promote the hardwood 10 industry.

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SECTION 2. (A) THE SUBJECTS OF TRANSFER OF THE DEPARTMENT <-</p>
OF COMMERCE ARE TRANSFERRED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
WITH THE SAME FORCE AND EFFECT AS IF THEY HAD ORIGINALLY
BELONGED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

(B) THE CIVIL SERVICE STATUS OF EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT
OF COMMERCE TRANSFERRED BY SUBSECTION (A) SHALL NOT BE AFFECTED
BY TRANSFER.

18 (C) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "SUBJECTS OF TRANSFER"19 MEANS PERSONNEL, APPROPRIATIONS, ALLOCATIONS, DOCUMENTS,

20 RECORDS, EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS, RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS UTILIZED

21 OR ACCRUING IN CONNECTION WITH THE FUNCTIONS TRANSFERRED BY THIS 22 ACT.

23 Section $\frac{2}{2}$ 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
