20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

21 hereby enacts as follows:

22 Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be 23 necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the 24 University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1996, to 25 June 30, 1997, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

1 (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$130,935,000 <---2 FOR EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL EXPENSES..... \$132,235,000 (1) <-----3 (2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only. 6,239,000 4 (3) For operation of dental clinics in the 1,030,000 5 school of dentistry..... 6 To enhance the recruitment and retention (4) of disadvantaged students..... 321,000 7 8 (5) For general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic..... 7,693,000 9 10 (6) For the teen suicide center at the Western 497,000 11 Psychiatric Institute and Clinic..... 12 (7) For the Graduate School of Public Health.. 250,000 13 14 Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on 15 account of the appropriations for all items as provided in 16 section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal 17 year. 18 Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may 19 transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1)20 and (2), provided that the aggregate amount transferred into or 21 out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not 22 exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that 23 purpose. 24 Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of 25 the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly

26 during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly 19960H2755B3908 - 2 - and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date
 on which such payment is to be made.

3 Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the 4 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are 5 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 6 7 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the 8 9 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor 10 General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each 11 branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and 12 purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by 13 this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any 14 15 appropriation during said fiscal year.

16 Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be (b) reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he 17 18 shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by 19 this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes 20 not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered 21 and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. 22 In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys 23 other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General 24 shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually 25 with the General Assembly such information concerning such 26 expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees 27 may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all 19960H2755B3908 - 3 - 1 programs, except for the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, 2 to be submitted prior to September 1, 1997, shall cover the 12-3 month period beginning with the summer term 1996 and shall 4 include:

5 (1) The following counts and distributions for each term6 during the period:

7 (i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed 8 full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time 9 students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students 10 enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students 11 enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled 12 in undergraduate courses.

13 (ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit 14 hours, divided into lower division and upper division course 15 levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three 16 course levels--master's, first professional and doctoral.

17 (iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of 18 instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction 19 scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by 20 two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) 21 categories of instructional programs of higher education as 22 defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United 23 States Department of Education.

The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof. 24 (iv) 25 (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in 26 total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a 27 classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, 28 29 assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, 30 librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other 19960H2755B3908 - 4 -

professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and nonteaching; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

7 (i) The number of faculty and other professional employees
8 and their full-time equivalence in instructional and
9 noninstructional functions.

10 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom 11 courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom 12 courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, 13 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

14 (iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate 15 individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned 16 to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into 17 lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and 18 doctoral course levels.

19 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours 20 and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 21 generated, divided into lower division, upper division, 22 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 23 (v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction 24 25 student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, 26 upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course 27 levels.

28 (vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and 29 for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary 30 paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal 19960H2755B3908 - 5 - 1 funds and other funds.

2 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 3 member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program 4 category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the 5 average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom 6 contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in 7 preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public 8 9 service.

10 Section 7. In addition to the requirements in section 6 11 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month 12 period beginning with the summer term 1996 shall include for all 13 programs of the university:

14 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate15 degree and for a master's degree.

16 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first
17 professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1992, 1993,
18 1994, 1995, 1996 and estimated 1997.

Section 8. (a) The following words and phrases when used in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

22 "Academic and administrative support units." Any 23 organizational entity, as defined in the organizational manual 24 of the university, that reports directly to the president of the 25 university, chief academic officer or vice president, including 26 the office of the president, chief academic officer and vice 27 president.

28 "Expenditures." Disbursements of State appropriations, 29 tuition and fees supporting educational and general categories 30 as defined in the Higher Education Finance Manual, Department of 19960H2755B3908 - 6 - Health, Education and Welfare, 1975, or disbursement, supported
 by State appropriations, tuition or fees, to support a defined
 project or program under subsection (b)(3).

4 "Revenue." All State appropriations and tuition and fees.
5 (b) The University of Pittsburgh shall disclose the
6 following:

7 (1) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the university's
8 academic and administrative support units for the current fiscal
9 year.

10 (2) The actual revenue and expenditures for the prior year 11 in the same format as the information reported under paragraph 12 (1).

13 (3) For any defined project or program which is the subject 14 of a specific line item appropriation from the General Fund, the 15 university shall disclose the following:

16 (i) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the defined program17 or project for the current fiscal year.

(ii) The actual revenue and expenditures of the defined
program or project for the prior year in the same format as the
information reported under paragraph (1).

(4) The revenue and expenditures of any auxiliary enterprise
which is directly funded in whole or in part by tuition or a
State appropriation for the current fiscal year.

(c) The university shall provide the following additional information for the prior fiscal year for each academic or administrative support unit, for each defined project or program and for any auxiliary enterprise:

(1) The number of employees by academic rank and by
classification the number of administrators, staff, clerical and
technical service employees.

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(2) Median and mean salary by academic rank and by
 classification the median and mean salaries of administrators,
 staff, clerical and technical service employees.

4 (3) Nonsalary compensation as a percentage of salary.
5 Nonsalary compensation shall include, but not be limited to,
6 medical benefits, life insurance benefits, pension benefits,
7 leave benefits, employer Social Security payments and workers'
8 compensation benefits.

9 (4) A statement of the university's retirement policies.
10 (5) A policy statement relating to a reduction of tuition
11 for employees' family members.

(6) A list of purchase of service contracts which exceed 12 13 \$1,000 by category of service, including, but not limited to, 14 legal, instructional, management, accounting, architecture, 15 public relations and maintenance. The list shall contain the 16 name and address of the contractor, a statement of the nature of 17 the duties of the contractor and the academic and administrative 18 support unit for which the duties are performed. If a purchase 19 of service contract exceeds 10% of the total aggregate 20 expenditure of the contract category per academic or 21 administrative support unit, then the contracted amount shall also be listed. 22

23 (7) A list of purchase of goods contracts which exceed \$1,000. The list shall contain the name and address of the 24 25 contractor and a list of the goods purchased and the academic or 26 administrative support unit for which such goods were 27 contracted. If a purchase of goods contract exceeds 10% of the 28 total aggregate expenditure per academic or administrative 29 support unit, then the contracted amount shall also be listed. 30 (8) A list by academic or administrative support unit in the 19960H2755B3908 - 8 -

aggregate, of the expenses of travel, subsistence and lodging,
 whether provided or reimbursed.

3 (d) The university shall submit a report of the information 4 under subsections (b) and (c) to the Education Committee of the 5 Senate and the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the 6 Education Committee of the House of Representatives and the 7 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives. In 8 addition, the university shall submit a copy of the report to 9 each of the following:

10 (1) Governor's Office.

11 (2) Secretary of Education.

12 (3) State Treasurer.

13 (4) Auditor General.

14 (5) Joint State Government Commission.

15 Each such institution shall maintain a copy of the report in the 16 institution's library and shall submit a copy to each of the 17 four State regional library resource centers.

(e) A university's report required to be submitted under
this section shall be submitted within 180 days of the close of
the university's current fiscal year.

21 (f) The Joint State Government Commission shall develop a 22 statistical comparison analysis recognizing differences in 23 missions from the reports made under this section. A majority of 24 the members of the commission may request additional 25 documentation, except for salary or identity of individuals, 26 necessary to complete the comparative analysis. The comparison 27 shall be provided to the Education Committee of the Senate and 28 the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Education 29 Committee of the House of Representatives and the Appropriations 30 Committee of the House of Representatives and the four State - 9 -19960H2755B3908

1 regional libraries.

(g) The university shall make a copy of the minutes of each
public meeting of the institution's board of trustees, as well
as a copy of the institution's integrated postsecondary
education data systems report, available for public inspection
in the institution's library.

7 Section 9. The University of Pittsburgh shall provide full, 8 complete and accurate information as may be required by the 9 Department of Education or the majority chairman or the minority 10 chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the 11 majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations 12 Committee of the House of Representatives.

13 Section 10. The University of Pittsburgh shall report its 14 revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements 15 required under the provisions of this act in accordance with 16 generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for 17 educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education 18 Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education 19 and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget 20 Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and 21 Universities." 22

23 Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1996, or 24 immediately, whichever is later.

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
