4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 1786(f) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 1786. Required financial responsibility.
9	* * *
10	(f) Operation of a motor vehicle without required financial
11	responsibilityAny owner of a motor vehicle for which the
12	existence of financial responsibility is a requirement for its
13	legal operation shall not operate the motor vehicle or permit it
14	to be operated upon a highway of this Commonwealth without the
15	financial responsibility required by this chapter. In addition
16	to the penalties provided by subsection (d), any person who
17	fails to comply with this subsection [commits a summary offense

1 and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$300.]
2 will be penalized as follows:

3 (1) For the first offense, the penalty shall be a
4 summary offense and the person shall, upon conviction, be
5 sentenced to pay a fine of \$500.

6 (2) For the second offense which occurs within five
7 years from the date of the first offense, the penalty shall
8 be a summary offense and the person shall, upon conviction,
9 be sentenced to pay a fine of \$1,000.

10 (3) For the third and each subsequent offense which
 11 occurs within five years of the first offense, the penalty

12 shall be a misdemeanor of the second degree and the person

13 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not

14 less than \$2,000 and not more than \$5,000 and imprisonment of

15 <u>no more than two years.</u>
