## AN ACT

123456789011234567890112345678901222222222222222222222222222222222222	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State government; providing for the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every department, board, commission, and officer of the State government, every political subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,

1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 2 3 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known 4 as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a section to read: 5 Section 206.1-A. Revocation of License.--(a) The board shall revoke the license of any retailer upon a third conviction 6 for violating the provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. § 6305 (relating to 7 8 sale of tobacco). 9 (b) Any retailers whose license has been revoked under subsection (a) shall be ineligible to obtain a license for a 10 period to be determined by the board, the minimum of which shall 11 12 be one year and the maximum of which shall be five years.
