## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An
- 2 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work;
- providing penalties; and making an appropriation, "further
- 4 providing for reciprocity.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 10 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220,
- 8 No.39), known as the Social Workers' Practice Act, is amended to
- 9 read:
- 10 Section 10. [Reciprocity.
- 11 The board shall have the power to grant a reciprocal license
- 12 to an applicant who is licensed or certified as a social worker
- 13 in another state and has demonstrated qualifications which equal
- 14 or exceed those required pursuant to this act in the
- 15 determination of the board, provided that no license shall be
- 16 granted under this section to an applicant unless the state in
- 17 which the applicant is licensed affords reciprocal treatment to
- 18 persons who are residents of this Commonwealth and who are

- 1 licensed pursuant to this act.] Reciprocity or endorsement.
- 2 Reciprocity or endorsement may be established at the
- 3 discretion of the board. As used in this section, the term
- 4 <u>"reciprocity" means the act of the board and a licensing</u>
- 5 <u>authority in another jurisdiction</u>, <u>each recognizing that the</u>
- 6 requirements for a license or certificate in this Commonwealth
- 7 and in the other jurisdiction are equivalent, issuing a license
- 8 or certificate to an applicant who possesses a similar license
- 9 or certificate in the other jurisdiction. As used in this
- 10 <u>section</u>, the term "endorsement" means the issuance of a license
- 11 or certificate by the board to an applicant who does not meet
- 12 <u>standard requirements</u>, if the applicant has achieved cumulative
- 13 qualifications which are accepted by the board as being
- 14 equivalent to the standard requirements for the license or
- 15 certificate.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
