A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 To create a commission of public and private cost-minded leaders
- 2 of this Commonwealth to study the management of current
- 3 government operations and make recommendations of cost-
- 4 cutting measures.
- 5 WHEREAS, The economic health of this Commonwealth is a top
- 6 priority; and
- WHEREAS, The tax burden of this Commonwealth's citizens and
- 8 businesses resulting from the cost of government operations and
- 9 administration can have a significant impact on the economic
- 10 health of this Commonwealth; and
- 11 WHEREAS, State government has an obligation of fiscal
- 12 responsibility and of limiting the tax burden it imposes; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Ten cents of every public dollar spent is committed
- 14 to general government operations; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There should be an organized bi-partisan effort to 2 determine ways in which government can be made more effective
- 3 and more efficient; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That a government
- 5 management and costs study commission of leaders from the public
- 6 and private sectors shall be formed to study Commonwealth
- 7 government operations and the experience of other states in an
- 8 effort to propose changes which will reduce costs, increase
- 9 accountability and improve service; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That this commission's recommendations shall
- 11 include those which:
- 12 (1) cut costs;
- 13 (2) increase efficiency;
- 14 (3) increase effectiveness;
- 15 (4) consolidate like functions;
- 16 (5) return functions and job creation opportunities to
- 17 the private sector; AND
- 18 (6) eliminate functions;
- 19 (7) establish a system for ongoing program evaluation; <

- 21 (8) establish a Statewide system of performance
- 22 measurement;
- 23 and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the commission shall be comprised of 17
- 25 members as follows:
- 26 (1) Four members to be appointed by the Governor, with
- at least three appointments being members of the general
- 28 public.
- 29 (2) Two THREE members to be appointed by the Majority
- 30 Leader of the Senate and two THREE members to be appointed by <-

- the Minority Leader of the Senate with no more than one
 appointment from each authority being a governmental official
 or employee.
- 4 (3) Two THREE members to be appointed by the Majority <-5 Leader of the House of Representatives and two THREE members <-6 to be appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
 7 Representatives with no more than one appointment from each
 8 authority being a governmental official or employee.
- 9 (4) The chairman and minority chairman of the Committee <-10 on Appropriations of the Senate.
- 11 (5) The chairman and minority chairman of the Committee

 12 on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.
- 13 (6) The Secretary of the Budget or a designee of the
 14 Secretary of the Budget;
- 15 (4) ONE MEMBER WHO SHALL NOT BE A GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIAL <—
 16 OR EMPLOYEE TO SERVE AS CHAIRMAN TO BE CHOSEN BY THE
- 17 GOVERNOR;
- 18 and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That these appointments are to be made within 30
- 20 days of the approval of this resolution by the Senate and the
- 21 House of Representatives; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the commission elect from among the members by <---
- 23 a majority vote of the members a chairperson; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the commission make a report of its findings
- 25 and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by
- 26 November 30 of this year at which time the commission shall
- 27 cease to exist; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the chairman shall rely on the existing staff
- 29 of the Governor's Office of the Budget and the Committee on
- 30 Appropriations of the Senate and the Committee on Appropriations

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- 1 of the House of Representatives APPOINTING AUTHORITIES AND THE
- 2 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE APPROPRIATIONS
- 3 COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO THE GREATEST EXTENT
- 4 POSSIBLE; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That necessary and reasonable costs and
- 6 expenditures of the commission are authorized to be paid from
- 7 funds already appropriated by the General Assembly to the Office
- 8 of the Budget and the Office of Administration; and be it
- 9 further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the commission shall comply with all the
- 11 duties and responsibilities of a covered agency under the act of
- 12 July 3, 1986 (P.L.388, No.84), known as the Sunshine Act.
