A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the commitment to excellence in education and athletics
2 of certain institutions of higher education in this
3 Commonwealth.

4 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has always been committed to
5 quality higher education; and

6 WHEREAS, There is also a considerable commitment to
7 athletics, and institutions of higher education throughout this
8 Commonwealth are to be congratulated for superior standings in
9 sports competition. Specifically, four institutions have
10 attained the great honor of playing in the National Collegiate
11 Division III Football Championship; and

12 WHEREAS, Allegheny College, located in Meadville,
13 Pennsylvania, joined the ranks of the National Collegiate
14 Division III Football Championship by achieving an outstanding

1 record of ten wins and no losses. Allegheny is to be honored for
2 both its academic and athletic achievements; and

3 WHEREAS, Dickinson College, located in Carlisle,
4 Pennsylvania, competed in the National Collegiate Division III
5 Football Championship for the third time in six years.
6 Dickinson's record was an exciting ten wins and no losses.
7 Dickinson's athletic superiority is rivaled only by its
8 outstanding academic standards; and

9 WHEREAS, Washington and Jefferson College, located in
10 Washington, Pennsylvania, also fought its way to the Division
11 III Championships. Washington and Jefferson posted an
12 outstanding record of eight wins and one loss. This record is
13 exemplary of the standards Washington and Jefferson sets in all
14 of its endeavors, be they athletic or academic; and

15 WHEREAS, Widener University, of Chester, Pennsylvania, is the
16 champion of the Middle Atlantic Conference. With a record of
17 nine wins and one loss, Widener also represents Pennsylvania in
18 the National Collegiate Division III Football Championship. The
19 citizens of this Commonwealth are proud of Widener's continuing
20 promotion of high academic standards as well as these noteworthy
21 athletic achievements; and

22 WHEREAS, The faculty and students of the aforementioned
23 schools are to be extolled for their dedication and commitment
24 to strict academic and athletic standards. The citizens of this
25 Commonwealth are proud to be home to these collegiate
26 institutions; therefore be it

27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor these four
28 institutions of higher education for the commitment and
29 dedication to excellence each has continually exemplified.
