- Recognizing the 100th Year of Women in State Legislatures and the many contributions women serving, or formerly serving, in
- 3 various capacities in the General Assembly of the
- 4 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have made to our legislative
- 5 process.
- 6 WHEREAS, The National Foundation for Women Legislators, Inc.,
- 7 which serves as the educational arm of the National Order of
- 8 Women Legislators, the oldest professional association for women
- 9 legislators in the country, is coordinating state, regional and
- 10 national celebrations to commemorate the 100th year of women
- 11 serving in state legislatures; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Women state legislators were elected to serve before
- 13 American women had the universal right to vote; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In January 1895 the first three women were sworn in

- 1 to serve as state legislators in Colorado; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Women began serving in the Pennsylvania election in
- 3 1923, following their elections in 1922, and include Alice
- 4 Bentley (1923-1928), Rosa DeYoung (1923-1924), Sarah Gallagher
- 5 (1923-1924), Helen Grimes (1923-1930), Sarah MacKinney (1923-
- 6 1924), Lillie Pitts (1923-1932), Martha Speiser (1923-1924) and
- 7 Martha Thomas (1923-1926); and
- 8 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes the women
- 9 currently and formerly serving in our legislature for their
- 10 contributions and accomplishments; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The celebration of this centennial will elevate
- 12 public knowledge and awareness of women in state history; and
- 13 WHEREAS, These women have served diligently and
- 14 enthusiastically, and have devoted much time and energy to their
- 15 communities and to our great Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Their knowledge, expertise and wise leadership are
- 17 valuable tools to carry Pennsylvania into the 21st century; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives extend
- 19 sincerest appreciation to all of these women legislators who
- 20 have served the Keystone State and would like to congratulate
