## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for arrest
- 3 without warrant.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 8902. Arrest without warrant.
- 9 A law enforcement POLICE officer shall have the same right of <--
- 10 arrest without warrant as exists or may hereafter exist in the
- 11 case of the commission of a felony, UPON PROBABLE CAUSE for any <---
- 12 of the following offenses:
