## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the confidentiality of medical records and for a 2 civil cause of action; and providing penalties.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 7 Confidentiality of Medical Records Act.
- 8 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 9 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds that computer
- 10 networks are increasingly being used to store confidential
- 11 medical records, which has increased the availability of this
- 12 information to nonauthorized personnel. Computer networks have
- 13 proven to be an invaluable tool in providing emergency health
- 14 care. The increased availability of these records, however,
- 15 requires strict laws regarding the access to and use of

- 1 confidential medical records.
- 2 (b) Intent.--It is the intent of the General Assembly to
- 3 promote the use of new technologies to improve medical care
- 4 while at the same time affording the public protection against
- 5 unauthorized access to and use of confidential medical records.
- 6 Section 3. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 8 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Computer network." The interconnection of two or more
- 11 computers through the usage of satellite, microwave, line or
- 12 other communication medium.
- "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 14 "Medical records." Medical charts or records of any health
- 15 care facility licensed under the laws of this Commonwealth.
- 16 Section 4. Notification of records transfer.
- 17 No medical records shall be transferred to any computer
- 18 network without prior notice being provided to the patient.
- 19 Notice in writing shall be provided to any patient whose records
- 20 have been transferred prior to the effective date of this act.
- 21 Section 5. Good faith access and use of records.
- 22 No cause of action shall arise for transfers in regard to
- 23 this section if the action was made in good faith for the
- 24 benefit of the patient in an emergency health care situation.
- 25 Section 6. Civil cause of action.
- 26 Any person aggrieved by a violation of this act shall have a
- 27 cause of action against the person who committed or ordered the
- 28 commission of such violation and may receive compensatory
- 29 damages. An aggrieved person may also recover reasonable
- 30 attorney fees and costs.

- 1 Section 7. Sentencing.
- 2 Any person who violates this act commits a misdemeanor of the
- 3 third degree and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a
- 4 fine of not more than \$2,000 and to imprisonment for not more
- 5 than one year.
- 6 Section 8. Separate violations.
- 7 Each disclosure of or access to confidential medical records
- 8 in violation of this act is separate for the purposes of
- 9 criminal prosecution and civil liability.
- 10 Section 9. Departmental regulations.
- 11 The department shall issue any additional regulations needed
- 12 to ensure the confidentiality of any medical records placed on a
- 13 computer network.
- 14 Section 10. Automation of medical records.
- Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit the use of
- 16 automation in medical records service, provided that all
- 17 provisions in this act are met and the information is readily
- 18 available for use in patient care.
- 19 Section 11. Effective date.
- 20 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
