AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, providing for the use of interior lights; and
- 3 further providing for the use of sun screening.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 4309. Use of interior light.
- 9 The operator of a vehicle equipped with an interior light,
- 10 when stopped by a law enforcement officer during the period when
- 11 lighted lamps are required under section 4302 (relating to
- 12 periods for requiring lighted lamps), shall activate an interior
- 13 light of the vehicle in order to illuminate the operator's
- 14 compartment of the vehicle. Any person who purposely refuses to
- 15 comply with this section commits a summary offense.
- 16 Section 2. Section 4524(e) of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 17 § 4524. Windshield obstructions and wipers.
- 18 * * *

- 1 (e) Sun screening and other materials prohibited.--
- [(1) No person shall drive any motor vehicle with any sun screening device or other material which does not permit a person to see or view the inside of the vehicle through the windshield, side wing or side window of the vehicle.
 - (2) This subsection does not apply to:
 - (i) A vehicle which is equipped with tinted windows of the type and specification that were installed by the manufacturer of the vehicle or to any hearse, ambulance, government vehicle or any other vehicle for which a currently valid certificate of exemption has been issued in accordance with regulations adopted by the department.
 - (ii) A vehicle which is equipped with tinted windows, sun screening devices or other materials which comply with all applicable Federal regulations and for which a currently valid certificate of exemption for medical reasons has been issued in accordance with regulations adopted by the department.
 - (3) A certificate of exemption shall be issued by the department for a vehicle which is:
 - (i) Registered in this Commonwealth on the effective date of this subsection and is equipped with a sun screening device or other material prohibited under paragraph (1) on the effective date.
 - (ii) Equipped with tinted windows, sun screening devices or other materials for a physical condition that makes it necessary to equip the motor vehicle with sun screening material which would be of a light transmittance or luminous reflectance in violation of this section.

- 1 (A) A certificate of exemption for medical 2 reasons shall be issued only if the owner or registrant of the vehicle, or a person residing in 3 4 the household of the owner or registrant who regularly drives or is driven in the vehicle, suffers 5 from a physical condition determined by the 6 department, in consultation with the Medical Advisory 7 8 Board, to justify the exemption.
 - (B) Any person requesting an exemption for medical reasons shall have his physical condition certified to the department by a licensed physician or optometrist.
 - (4) A certificate of exemption issued under this subsection shall be carried in the vehicle and displayed on request of a police officer.
- 16 (5) Upon the sale or transfer of the vehicle to any 17 person who does not qualify under paragraph (2)(ii), the 18 exemption shall be null and void. Prior to the sale or transfer of an exempt vehicle, it shall be the sole 19 20 responsibility of the owner or seller of a formerly exempt 21 vehicle to remove all sun screening or other materials from the vehicle. At the time of the sale or transfer of a 22 23 formerly exempt vehicle, the owner shall remove and destroy 24 the certificate of exemption for physical reasons and provide the purchaser with a notarized statement setting forth the 25 26 name and address of the owner or seller, the vehicle 27 identification number, year and model, and the business 28 entity and process used to remove the sun screening or other 29 material.
- 30 (1) No person may operate on any public highway, road or

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- 1 <u>street a motor vehicle that is registered or required to be</u>
- 2 registered in this Commonwealth that has a sun screening
- device on the windshield, the front side wings and side
- 4 <u>windows adjacent to the right and left of the driver and</u>
- 5 <u>windows adjacent to the rear of the driver that does not meet</u>
- 6 <u>the requirements of this subsection.</u>
- 7 (2) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the use of
- 8 any product or materials along the top edge of the windshield
- 9 so long as such product and materials are transparent and do
- not encroach upon the AS-1 portion of the windshield.
- 11 (3) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to
- the use of any aftermarket sunscreening device that
- duplicates, to exact specifications, a sunscreening device
- available from the manufacturer as an option.
- 15 (4) A sun screening device when used in conjunction with
- the automotive safety glazing materials of the side wings or
- 17 side windows located at the immediate right and left of the
- driver shall be a nonreflective type with reflectivity of not
- 19 more than 15% and have a light transmission of not less than
- 35%. A sun screening device when used in conjunction with the
- 21 automotive safety glazing materials on the rear side windows
- and the rearmost windows shall be a nonreflective type with
- 23 reflectivity of not more than 15% and have a light
- transmission of not less than 35%. If a sun screening device
- 25 is used on glazing behind the driver, one right and one left
- outside rearview mirror is required.
- 27 (5) Each manufacturer shall:
- 28 <u>(i) Certify to the department that a sun screening</u>
- 29 <u>device used by it is in compliance with the reflectivity</u>
- and transmittance requirements of this subsection.

(ii) Provide a label not to exceed one and one-half
square inches in size, with a means for the permanent and
legible installations between the sun screening material
and each glazing surface to which it is applied that
contains the manufacturer's name and its percentage of
light transmission.

(iii) Include instructions with the product or material for proper installation, including the affixing of the label specified in this subsection. The labeling or marking must be placed in the left lower corner of each glazing surface when facing the vehicle from the outside.

(6) No person may:

- (i) Offer for sale or for use any sun screening product or material for motor vehicle use not in compliance with this subsection.
- (ii) Install any sun screening product or material on vehicles intended for use on public roads without permanently affixing the label specified in this subsection.
- (7) This subsection does not apply to a vehicle which is 21 equipped with tinted windows of the type and specification 22 23 that were installed by the manufacturer of the vehicle or to 2.4 any hearse, ambulance or government vehicle. The light transmittance requirement of this subsection does not apply 25 to windows behind the driver on trucks, buses, trailers, 26 27 mobile homes and multipurpose passenger vehicles which are 28 constructed on a truck chassis or equipped by the manufacturer with special features for occasional off-road 29 30 operations.

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1	(8) A person who violates the provisions of this
2	subsection commits a summary offense.
3	(9) The department shall approve devices which police
4	officers may use to measure the degree of tinting of windows
5	for the purpose of enforcing compliance with this subsection.
6	(10) As used in this subsection:
7	"Bus." A motor vehicle with motive power, except a
8	trailer, designed for carrying more than ten persons.
9	"Light transmission." The ratio of the amount of total
LO	light to pass through a product or material to the amount of
L1	the total light falling on the product or material. A 7%
L2	tolerance shall be allowed when checking the light
L3	transmission for enforcement purposes.
L4	"Luminous reflectants." The ratio of the amount of total
L5	light that is reflected outward by the product or material to
L6	the amount of the total light falling on the product or
L7	<pre>material.</pre>
L8	"Manufacturer." Any person engaged in the manufacturing
L9	or assembling of sun screening products or materials designed
20	to be used in conjunction with vehicle glazing materials for
21	the purpose of reducing the effects of the sun.
22	"Motor homes." Vehicular units designed to provide
23	temporary living quarters built into and an integral part of
24	or permanently attached to a self-propelled motor vehicle
25	chassis.
26	"Multipurpose passenger vehicle." A motor vehicle with
27	motive power, except a trailer, designed to carry ten persons
28	or less which is constructed either on a truck chassis or
29	with special features for occasional off-road operation.
30	"Nonreflective." A product or material designed to

- 1 absorb light rather than to reflect it.
- "Sun screening device." Film material or device that is 2
- designed to be used in conjunction with motor vehicle safety 3
- glazing materials for reducing the effect of the sun. 4
- 5 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
