## AN ACT

Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, providing for additional classes of licenses and 3 special stamps; and increasing and adding license fees. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 2705(7) of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by 8 adding paragraphs to read: 9 § 2705. Classes of licenses. 10 Unless otherwise provided, any person wishing to exercise any 11 of the privileges granted by this title shall first secure the 12 applicable resident or nonresident hunting or furtaker license as follows: 13 14 [(Reserved).] Senior lifetime resident combination 15 16 hunting and furtaker license to residents who have reached or 17 will reach their 65th birthday in the year of the application

for the license. The commission shall develop, implement and

1 administer a system to provide tags, report cards and
2 applications to those residents who hold a senior lifetime

3 <u>resident hunting license issued under this paragraph. The</u>

4 system shall require the applicant or license holder to pay

5 any approved fee assessed by the issuing agent.

(7.1) Junior resident combination hunting and furtaker 6 7 license to residents who have reached or will reach their 12th birthday in the <u>calendar year of application for a</u> 8 9 license but who have not reached their 17th birthday prior to the date of the application for the license and who present a 10 written request, containing the signature of a parent or 11 12 quardian, for the issuance of a license. The actual 13 privileges granted to the holder of a junior resident combination license shall not be exercised until that person 14 in fact is 12 years of age. 15

(11.1) Junior nonresident combination hunting and 17 18 furtaker license to nonresidents who have reached or will reach their 12th birthday in the calendar year of application 19 20 for a license but who have not reached their 17th birthday prior to the date of the application for the license and who 21 present a written request, containing the signature of a 22 23 parent or quardian, for the issuance of a license. The actual 2.4 privileges granted to the holder of a junior nonresident combination license shall not be exercised until that person 25 in fact is 12 years of age. 26

- 2 of 75¢ for each license or replacement license.
- 3 Section 3. This act shall apply to the license year
- 4 beginning on July 1, 1998, and to each license year thereafter.
- 5 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1997, or
- 6 immediately, whichever is later.
