- 4 and public and private elementary and secondary schools and
- 5 <u>organizations on juvenile crime</u>.
- 6 (2) Provide for distribution to school entities and public
- 7 and private or nonpublic elementary and secondary schools in
- 8 this Commonwealth materials on juvenile crime. Such materials
- 9 shall include, but need not be limited to, the mechanics of the
- 10 juvenile justice system and the nature of delinquency
- 11 proceedings, the penalties for committing a crime that would be
- 12 graded higher than a misdemeanor if committed by an adult and
- 13 the consequences of committing a crime.
- 14 (3) The Secretary of Education shall prepare and submit an
- 15 <u>annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly outlining</u>
- 16 juvenile crime programs and achievements, highlighting new
- 17 <u>initiatives and recommending future programs.</u>
- 18 (4) The Secretary of Education shall consult at least
- 19 annually with the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police,
- 20 and other law enforcement personnel which the Secretary of
- 21 Education deems necessary, in order to prepare the materials and
- 22 assess the trends of juvenile crime in this Commonwealth.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
