A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, permitting jurors to take notes during civil and criminal trials.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That Article V be amended by adding a section to read:
9	<u>§ 19. Jurors.</u>
10	Jurors may take notes during any civil or criminal trial
11	subject to rules adopted by the Supreme Court.
12	Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
13	Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
14	Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
15	comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
16	XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
17	required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in

which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

3 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this 4 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 5 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 6 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 7 8 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 9 10 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 11 12 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 13 primary, general or municipal election occurring at least three 14 months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by 15 the General Assembly which meets the requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of 16 17 Pennsylvania.
