4 (3) Electronic devices which calculate speed by
5 measuring elapsed time between measured road surface points
6 by using two sensors and devices which measure and calculate
7 the average speed of a vehicle between any two points may be
8 used by any police officer.

9 (3.1) (i) Electronic devices such as radio-microwave devices (commonly referred to as electronic speed meters 10 or radar) may be used by full-time police officers of 11 departments serving cities of the first class, second 12 13 class, second class A and third class. These departments shall include those organized as regional departments as 14 established by the act of July 12, 1972 (P.L.762, 15 No.180), referred to as the Intergovernmental Cooperation 16 Law, and serve more than one municipality, one of which 17 18 shall be a city of the first class, a city of the second class, a city of the second class A or a city of the 19 20 third class. The police officers using the electronic devices must have satisfactorily completed the 21 requirements of the act of June 18, 1974 (P.L.359, 22 23 No.120), referred to as the Municipal Police Education 2.4 and Training Law, and who have been trained in the use of radar in a program approved by the Commissioner of the 25 Pennsylvania State Police. 26 27 (ii) This paragraph shall expire five years from the 28 effective date of this paragraph, unless extended by 29 statute. 30 (4) No person may be convicted upon evidence obtained

through the use of devices authorized by paragraphs (2) 1 2 [and], (3) and (3.1) unless the speed recorded is six or more 3 miles per hour in excess of the legal speed limit. Furthermore, no person may be convicted upon evidence 4 obtained through the use of devices authorized by [paragraph] 5 paragraphs (3) and (3.1) in an area where the legal speed 6 7 limit is less than 55 miles per hour if the speed recorded is 8 less than ten miles per hour in excess of the legal speed 9 limit. This paragraph shall not apply to evidence obtained 10 through the use of devices authorized by [paragraph] paragraphs (3) and (3.1) within a school zone. 11 * * * 12 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
