10	Section 1. Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
11	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:

15	(a) General rule The Department of Public Welfare shall
16	draft rules and regulations to ensure the confidentiality of
17	Social Security numbers on records or applications for a

- 2 permit; driver's license, including a commercial driver's
- 3 <u>license; recreational license; marriage license; divorce decree;</u>
- 4 <u>support order; paternity determination or acknowledgments of</u>
- 5 paternity or other like records; records relating to death,
- 6 <u>including death certificates; employment records; or other</u>
- 7 records collected by law for use by the department, the court or
- 8 the domestic relations section solely for purposes of child and
- 9 spousal support enforcement, except for when otherwise provided
- 10 for by law.
- 11 (b) Collection on separate form. -- Any governmental agency or
- 12 <u>employer required to collect Social Security numbers on records</u>
- 13 or applications for professional or occupational licenses or
- 14 certifications; driver's permits; driver's licenses, including
- 15 <u>commercial driver's licenses; recreational licenses; marriage</u>
- 16 <u>licenses; divorce decrees; support orders; paternity</u>
- 17 <u>determinations or acknowledgments of paternity or other such</u>
- 18 records; records relating to death, including death
- 19 certificates; employment records; or other records collected by
- 20 law for use by the department, the court or the domestic
- 21 relations section solely for purposes of child and spousal
- 22 support enforcement shall collect those Social Security numbers
- 23 on a separate form not open to public inspection or
- 24 <u>dissemination until the department develops the rules and</u>
- 25 regulations to ensure the confidentiality of Social Security
- 26 <u>numbers</u>, except for when otherwise provided for by law.
- 27 (c) Identifying numbers.--The department shall draft rules
- 28 and regulations for the use of identifying numbers, other than
- 29 Social Security numbers, for use on all records collected by law
- 30 for use by the department, the court or the domestic relations

- section solely for purposes of child and spousal support and 1
- 2 <u>enforcement</u>, for individuals who do not have Social Security
- 3 numbers. Any governmental agency or employer may use established
- identifying numbers, such as Federal employee identification 4
- numbers, Federal visa numbers, local property and other tax 5
- numbers, driver's licenses or vehicle registrations to provide 6
- 7 identification for the person until the department drafts its
- 8 rules and regulations.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 9
