5	be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 1998.
6	Section 102. DefinitionsThe following words and phrases

29	group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
30	share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
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costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 1 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 2 3 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 4 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of 5 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 6 7 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 8 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State 9 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 10 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution 11 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 12 medical assistance program.

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Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 1 2 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 3 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 4 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 5 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 6 7 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 8 9 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the 10 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 11 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 12 13 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

14 (b) State Lottery Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 15 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 16 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the 17 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 18 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 19 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 20 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 21 22 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 23 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 24 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 25 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 26 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 27 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

28 (c) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund.--The following 29 sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be 30 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Energy 19980H2281B3395 - 13 -

Conservation and Assistance Fund to the several hereinafter 1 2 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 3 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 4 the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment 5 of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and 6 7 activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills 8 9 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 10 ending June 30, 1998.

11 (d) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account. -- The 12 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 13 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 14 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 15 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 16 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 17 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 18 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 19 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 20 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 21 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 22 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred 23 24 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 25 30, 1998.

(e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The
 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several
 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
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Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services 1 2 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 3 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 4 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 5 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the 6 7 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998. 8

The State Stores Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 9 (f) 10 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 11 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 12 hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the 13 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 14 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 15 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 16 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 17 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 18 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 19 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 20 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 21 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 22 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

23 (g) Motor License Fund. -- The following sums, or as much 24 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the 25 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 26 Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and 27 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 28 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 29 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper 30 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes - 15 -19980H2281B3395

hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

4 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following 5 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 6 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 7 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 8 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills 9 10 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 11 ending June 30, 1998.

(i) Hazardous Material Response Fund. -- The following sums 12 13 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 14 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material 15 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 16 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 17 18 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 19 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 20 21 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 22 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998. 23

24 (j) Milk Marketing Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 25 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 26 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the 27 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 28 29 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 30 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 19980H2281B3395 - 16 -

contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

8 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 9 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 10 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 11 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 12 13 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 14 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 15 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 16 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 17 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 18 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 19 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 20 beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred 21 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 22 30, 1998.

23 (1) Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund.--The following sums 24 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 25 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Ben Franklin/IRC 26 Partnership Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 27 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 28 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the 29 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 30 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 19980H2281B3395 - 17 -

1 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 2 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 3 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 4 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 5 beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred 6 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 7 30, 1998.

8 Tuition Payment Fund. -- The following sums set forth in (m) 9 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 10 specifically appropriated from the Tuition Payment Fund to the 11 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 12 13 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 14 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 15 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 16 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 17 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 18 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 19 20 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 21 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

22 Banking Department Fund.--The following sums set forth (n) 23 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 24 specifically appropriated from the Banking Department Fund to 25 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 26 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 27 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 28 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 29 30 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 19980H2281B3395 - 18 -

provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998.

(o) Firearm Ownership Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 6 7 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Firearm Ownership Fund to the 8 9 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 10 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 11 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 12 13 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 14 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 15 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 16 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 17 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 18 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998. 19 20 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The 21 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this 22 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 23

24 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and 25 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the 26 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated 27 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and for the 28 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998. Unless otherwise stated, 29 30 the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 19980H2281B3395 - 19 -

1 year.

Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations .--2 3 The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as 4 may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 5 Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 6 7 Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year 8 beginning July 1, 1998, and for the payment of bills incurred 9 10 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 11 30, 1998. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include 12 any carryover from the prior fiscal year.

Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
cities and communities that have a high concentration of
impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
community development needs.

(c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 19980H2281B3395 - 20 - addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

5 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The 6 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is 7 for the provision of preventive health and other health services 8 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants, 9 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health 10 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis, domestic 11 violence services and rodent control.

12 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 13 14 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in 15 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 16 preqnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 17 special health care needs, and in providing health services for 18 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 19 care.

20 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-21 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 22 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income 23 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 24 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 25 26 received pursuant to a Presidential release of weather-related 27 contingency funds shall be exempt from the 15% requirement if 28 the weather emergency has an impact in Pennsylvania. Unexpended weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being 29 30 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services 19980H2281B3395 - 21 -

1 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the
2 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall
3 notify the majority chairman and the minority chairman of the
4 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the majority chairman
5 and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the
6 House of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such
7 funds ten days prior to any reallocation.

8 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
9 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
10 persons.

(h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of services to adults with serious mental illness or children with serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the availability of child care for low-income families.

(k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.-The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
training and support services, child welfare and administration
for eligible families and individuals.
