AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, further providing for speed timing devices.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 3368(c) and (d) of Title 75 of the
- 6 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 7 § 3368. Speed timing devices.
- 8 * * *
- 9 (c) Mechanical, electrical and electronic devices
- 10 authorized.--
- 11 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the
- 12 rate of speed of any vehicle may be timed on any highway by a
- 13 police officer using a mechanical or electrical speed timing
- 14 device.
- 15 (2) (i) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (3),
- 16 electronic devices such as radio-microwave devices

1 (commonly referred to as electronic speed meters or
2 radar) may be used only by members of the Pennsylvania
3 State Police.

- (ii) Laser devices, commonly referred to as LIDAR units, may be used by members of the Pennsylvania State Police and by all local full-time police officers, upon the completion of a training course as mandated by department regulations. For the purposes of this paragraph, LIDAR, or light detection and ranging units shall refer to hand-held detection devices using an infrared light wave to measure and calculate speed.
- (3) Electronic devices which calculate speed by measuring elapsed time between measured road surface points by using two sensors and devices which measure and calculate the average speed of a vehicle between any two points may be used by any police officer.
- 17 (4) No person may be convicted upon evidence obtained 18 through the use of devices authorized by paragraphs (2) and 19 (3) unless the speed recorded is six or more miles per hour in excess of the legal speed limit. Furthermore, no person 20 21 may be convicted upon evidence obtained through the use of 22 devices authorized by paragraph (3) in an area where the 23 legal speed limit is less than 55 miles per hour if the speed 24 recorded is less than ten miles per hour in excess of the 25 legal speed limit. This paragraph shall not apply to evidence 26 obtained through the use of devices authorized by paragraph 27 (3) within a school zone.
- 28 (d) Classification, approval and testing of mechanical,
- 29 electrical and electronic devices. -- The department may, by
- 30 regulation, classify specific devices as being mechanical,

- 1 electrical or electronic. All mechanical, electrical or
- 2 electronic devices shall be of a type approved by the
- 3 department, which shall appoint stations for calibrating and
- 4 testing the devices and may prescribe regulations as to the
- 5 manner in which calibrations and tests shall be made. The
- 6 certification and calibration of electronic devices under
- 7 subsection (c)(3) shall also include the certification and
- 8 calibration of all equipment, timing strips and other devices
- 9 which are actually used with the particular electronic device
- 10 being certified and calibrated. The devices shall have been
- 11 tested for accuracy within a period of 60 days prior to the
- 12 alleged violation. A certificate from the station showing that
- 13 the calibration and test were made within the required period,
- 14 and that the device was accurate, shall be competent and prima
- 15 facie evidence of those facts in every proceeding in which a
- 16 violation of this title is charged. Except as otherwise
- 17 provided, LIDAR laser devices and electronic speed meters or
- 18 radar shall have been tested for accuracy within a period of
- 19 three years prior to the alleged violation in accordance with
- 20 <u>specifications prescribed by the National Highway Traffic Safety</u>
- 21 Administration (NHTSA). Furthermore, all electronic devices such
- 22 as LIDAR laser devices and electronic speed devices, such as
- 23 speed meters or radar, approved for use in this Commonwealth
- 24 <u>must appear on the International Association of Chiefs of Police</u>
- 25 consumer products list, in conjunction with the National Highway
- 26 Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) standards.

- 28 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
