AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further providing for persons ineligible for
3 licensing.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1503(c) introductory paragraph and (3) of
7 Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended
8 to read:

9 § 1503. Persons ineligible for licensing.

10 * * *

11 (c) Junior driver's license.--The department may issue a
12 junior driver's license to a person 16 or 17 years of age under
13 rules and regulations adopted by the department and subject to
14 the provisions of this section. A junior driver's license shall
15 [automatically] become a regular driver's license when the
16 licensee furnishes to the department satisfactory proof that the
17 licensee has received a high school diploma or completed a high
18 school equivalency program approved by the Department of

1 Education or attains [18] 21 years of age.

2 * * *

3 (3) In addition to the other provisions of this title
4 relating to the suspension or revocation of operating
5 privileges, in the event that a licensed junior driver is
6 involved in an accident for which they are partially or fully
7 responsible in the opinion of the department or is convicted
8 of any violation of this title, the department may suspend
9 the operating privileges of such person [until the person
10 attains 18 years of age or] for a period of time not
11 exceeding 90 days.

12 * * *

13 Section 2. The amendment of 75 Pa.C.S. § 1503 shall apply to
14 junior drivers' licenses issued on or after the effective date
15 of this act.

16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
