A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Establishing a select committee of the General Assembly to
- 2 investigate the issue of violence in elementary and secondary
- 3 schools in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, The General Assembly finds that there have been
- 5 several very serious instances of violence committed in schools
- 6 throughout our nation and this Commonwealth resulting in the
- 7 death and serious injury of elementary and secondary students;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, There have been a number of recent reports in our
- 10 Commonwealth detailing violent incidents resulting in the injury
- 11 of students, faculty and staff, some of which have involved
- 12 dangerous weapons brought onto school property or into school-
- 13 sponsored functions; and
- 14 WHEREAS, These violent incidents have occurred in rural,
- 15 suburban and urban school settings; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is of great concern to the citizens of this
- 17 Commonwealth that a safe atmosphere be provided to all students
- 18 to facilitate their education and instruction; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That a
- 2 select committee be established to investigate and study the
- 3 causes and incidents of school violence and programs which have
- 4 been implemented in Pennsylvania and elsewhere to address and
- 5 alleviate the causes and incidents of school violence; and be it
- 6 further
- 7 RESOLVED, That this select committee formulate
- 8 recommendations to the General Assembly which could be
- 9 implemented for the purposes of decreasing the causes and
- 10 incidents of school violence in all areas throughout this
- 11 Commonwealth; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the committee consist of the following
- 13 members:
- 14 (1) One member appointed by the Majority Leader of the
- 15 Senate.
- 16 (2) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 17 Senate.
- 18 (3) One member appointed by the Majority Leader of the
- 19 House of Representatives.
- 20 (4) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 21 House of Representatives.
- 22 (5) One representative of the Pennsylvania State
- 23 Education Association appointed by the Governor.
- 24 (6) One representative of the Pennsylvania School Boards
- 25 Association appointed by the Governor.
- 26 (7) The Secretary of Education or his designee.
- 27 (8) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police or
- his designee.
- 29 (9) The Attorney General or his designee.
- 30 (10) One member appointed by the Governor who is a

- 1 representative of an organization recognized for its
- 2 involvement in firearm safety education.
- 3 (11) One member appointed by the Governor who is a
- 4 mental health professional;
- 5 and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the committee elect a chair from its
- 7 membership; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take
- 9 testimony and make its investigation at such places as it deems
- 10 necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That each member of the committee have the power to
- 12 administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses appearing before
- 13 the committee; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the committee be given the authority to issue
- 15 subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum to insure the appearance of
- 16 witnesses and the production of documents for examination by the
- 17 committee; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the committee make a report of its findings
- 19 and recommendations by November 30, 1998; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the members of the committee serve without
- 21 compensation but be reimbursed for all necessary and actual
- 22 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; and be it
- 23 further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the actual expenses incurred by the committee
- 25 be equally divided between the Senate and the House of
- 26 Representatives.
