4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

5 hereby enacts as follows:

- 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 4120. Identity theft.
- 9 <u>A person commits an offense of identity theft of another</u>
- 10 person, a misdemeanor of the first degree, if he takes, assumes
- 11 or uses the identity, name, birth date, Social Security number

12 or identification of another person without the consent of that

13 other person and with the intent to:

1	(1) cause financial loss to the other person;
2	(2) obtain goods or services; or
3	(3) otherwise assume or use the other person's identity
4	for any unlawful purpose.
5	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
