# HOUSE BILL No. 982 Session of 1999

#### INTRODUCED BY BARLEY, MARCH 22, 1999

### REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, MARCH 22, 1999

#### A SUPPLEMENT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19	To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State- related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and for certain fiscal information disclosure.
20	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
21	hereby enacts as follows:
22	Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
23	necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the
24	University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1999, to
25	June 30, 2000, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

26 (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$144,318,000

1 (2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only. 6,735,000 2 (3) For operation of dental clinics in the 3 school of dentistry..... 1,112,000 4 (4) To enhance the recruitment and retention 346,000 5 of disadvantaged students..... 6 (5) For general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic..... 8,305,000 7 8 (6) For the teen suicide center at the Western 9 (7) For the Graduate School of Public Health.. 270,000 10 11 (8) For rural education outreach..... 538,000 Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on 12 13 account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal 14 15 year.

Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2), provided that the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

22 Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of 23 the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly 24 during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

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1 Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are 2 3 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper 4 records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 5 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the 6 7 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each 8 9 branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and 10 purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by 11 this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any 12 13 appropriation during said fiscal year.

14 Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be (b) 15 reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by 16 17 this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes 18 not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered 19 and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. 20 In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys 21 other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General 22 shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually 23 with the General Assembly such information concerning such 24 expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees 25 may require.

26 Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and 27 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and 28 House of Representatives and shall include data for all 29 programs, except for the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, 30 to be submitted prior to September 1, 2000, shall cover the 12-19990H0982B1090 - 3 - 1 month period beginning with the summer term 1999 and shall
2 include:

3 (1) The following counts and distributions for each term4 during the period:

5 (i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed 6 full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time 7 students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students 8 enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students 9 enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled 10 in undergraduate courses.

11 (ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit 12 hours, divided into lower division and upper division course 13 levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three 14 course levels--master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof. 22 (iv) 23 (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in 24 total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a 25 classification of faculty members or other professional 26 employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, 27 assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, 28 librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other 29 professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type 30 of assignment: teaching and nonteaching; and each such set of 19990H0982B1090 - 4 -

1 faculty members or other professional employees to be further
2 subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and
3 the following aggregates for each such subdivided
4 classification:

5 (i) The number of faculty and other professional employees
6 and their full-time equivalence in instructional and
7 noninstructional functions.

8 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom 9 courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom 10 courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 11 (iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate 12 13 individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned 14 to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into 15 lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 16

17 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours 18 and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 19 generated, divided into lower division, upper division, 20 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

30 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 19990H0982B1090 - 5 - 1 member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program
2 category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the
3 average hours per week spent in university-related activities,
4 stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom
5 contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in
6 preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public
7 service.

8 Section 7. In addition to the requirements in section 6 9 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month 10 period beginning with the summer term 1999 shall include for all 11 programs of the university:

12 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate13 degree and for a master's degree.

14 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first
15 professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1995, 1996,
16 1997, 1998, 1999 and estimated 2000.

Section 8. (a) The following words and phrases when used in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

20 "Academic and administrative support units." Any 21 organizational entity, as defined in the organizational manual 22 of the university, that reports directly to the president of the 23 university, chief academic officer or vice president, including 24 the office of the president, chief academic officer and vice 25 president.

26 "Expenditures." Disbursements of State appropriations, 27 tuition and fees supporting educational and general categories 28 as defined in the Higher Education Finance Manual, Department of 29 Health, Education and Welfare, 1975, or disbursement, supported 30 by State appropriations, tuition or fees, to support a defined 19990H0982B1090 - 6 - 1 project or program under subsection (b)(3).

2 "Revenue." All State appropriations and tuition and fees.
3 (b) The University of Pittsburgh shall disclose the
4 following:

5 (1) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the university's
6 academic and administrative support units for the current fiscal
7 year.

8 (2) The actual revenue and expenditures for the prior year 9 in the same format as the information reported under paragraph 10 (1).

11 (3) For any defined project or program which is the subject 12 of a specific line item appropriation from the General Fund, the 13 university shall disclose the following:

14 (i) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the defined program15 or project for the current fiscal year.

16 (ii) The actual revenue and expenditures of the defined 17 program or project for the prior year in the same format as the 18 information reported under paragraph (1).

(4) The revenue and expenditures of any auxiliary enterprise
which is directly funded in whole or in part by tuition or a
State appropriation for the current fiscal year.

(c) The university shall provide the following additional information for the prior fiscal year for each academic or administrative support unit, for each defined project or program and for any auxiliary enterprise:

(1) The number of employees by academic rank and by
classification the number of administrators, staff, clerical and
technical service employees.

29 (2) Median and mean salary by academic rank and by 30 classification the median and mean salaries of administrators, 19990H0982B1090 - 7 - 1 staff, clerical and technical service employees.

(3) Nonsalary compensation as a percentage of salary.
Nonsalary compensation shall include, but not be limited to,
medical benefits, life insurance benefits, pension benefits,
leave benefits, employer Social Security payments and workers'
compensation benefits.

7 (4) A statement of the university's retirement policies.
8 (5) A policy statement relating to a reduction of tuition
9 for employees' family members.

10 (6) A list of purchase of service contracts which exceed 11 \$1,000 by category of service, including, but not limited to, legal, instructional, management, accounting, architecture, 12 13 public relations and maintenance. The list shall contain the 14 name and address of the contractor, a statement of the nature of 15 the duties of the contractor and the academic and administrative 16 support unit for which the duties are performed. If a purchase 17 of service contract exceeds 10% of the total aggregate 18 expenditure of the contract category per academic or 19 administrative support unit, then the contracted amount shall 20 also be listed.

21 (7) A list of purchase of goods contracts which exceed 22 \$1,000. The list shall contain the name and address of the 23 contractor and a list of the goods purchased and the academic or administrative support unit for which such goods were 24 25 contracted. If a purchase of goods contract exceeds 10% of the 26 total aggregate expenditure per academic or administrative 27 support unit, then the contracted amount shall also be listed. 28 (8) A list by academic or administrative support unit in the 29 aggregate, of the expenses of travel, subsistence and lodging, 30 whether provided or reimbursed.

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1 (d) The university shall submit a report of the information 2 under subsections (b) and (c) to the Education Committee of the 3 Senate and the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the 4 Education Committee of the House of Representatives and the 5 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives. In 6 addition, the university shall submit a copy of the report to 7 each of the following:

8 (1) Governor's Office.

9 (2) Secretary of Education.

10 (3) State Treasurer.

11 (4) Auditor General.

12 (5) Joint State Government Commission.

13 Each such institution shall maintain a copy of the report in the 14 institution's library and shall submit a copy to each of the 15 four State regional library resource centers.

16 (e) A university's report required to be submitted under 17 this section shall be submitted within 180 days of the close of 18 the university's current fiscal year.

19 (f) The Joint State Government Commission shall develop a 20 statistical comparison analysis recognizing differences in 21 missions from the reports made under this section. A majority of 22 the members of the commission may request additional 23 documentation, except for salary or identity of individuals, necessary to complete the comparative analysis. The comparison 24 25 shall be provided to the Education Committee of the Senate and 26 the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Education 27 Committee of the House of Representatives and the Appropriations 28 Committee of the House of Representatives and the four State regional libraries. 29

30 (g) The university shall make a copy of the minutes of each 19990H0982B1090 - 9 - public meeting of the institution's board of trustees, as well
 as a copy of the institution's integrated postsecondary
 education data systems report, available for public inspection
 in the institution's library.

5 Section 9. The University of Pittsburgh shall provide full, 6 complete and accurate information as may be required by the 7 Department of Education or the majority chairman or the minority 8 chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the 9 majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations 10 Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 10. The University of Pittsburgh shall report its 11 revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements 12 13 required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for 14 15 educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education 16 Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education 17 and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget 18 Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-19 Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and 20 Universities."

21 Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999, or 22 immediately, whichever is later.

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
