AN ACT

- 1 Providing for production of child-care certification and
- licensing documents; requiring child day-care personnel to
- provide criminal and child abuse history information; and
- 4 conferring powers and duties on the Department of Public
- 5 Welfare.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Child-care
- 10 Facilities Supervision BACKGROUND CHECK Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Child day care." Care in lieu of parental care given for
- 16 part of a 24-hour day to a child under 16 years of age away from
- 17 the child's home. The term does not include care in lieu of
- 18 parental care given to a child under 16 years of age in a place

- 1 of worship during religious services.
- 2 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 "Family day-care home." A home in which day care is provided
- 5 at any one time to four, five or six children who are not
- 6 relatives of the provider of the child day care and which is
- 7 registered under the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Public Welfare Code.
- 9 Section 3. Request for production of documents.
- 10 During any and all inspections, or investigations of any
- 11 complaint, of any person or facility that provides any type of
- 12 child care, the individual or individuals required to conduct
- 13 the inspection or investigation shall specifically request
- 14 production of any and all documents pertaining to child-care
- 15 certification or licensing OR ANY OTHER DOCUMENTATION that have
- 16 been issued by any Federal, State or local government entity to
- 17 the child-care provider.
- 18 Section 4. Family day-care homes.
- 19 (a) Criminal and child abuse history information.--In
- 20 addition to the requirements of 23 Pa.C.S. § 6344 (relating to
- 21 information relating to prospective child-care personnel), an
- 22 individual who applies to the department for a registration
- 23 certificate to operate a family day-care home shall include
- 24 criminal and child abuse reports required by 23 Pa.C.S. §
- 25 6344(b) for every individual 18 years of age or older who
- 26 resides in the home for at least 30 days in a calendar year.
- 27 (b) Nonissuance, nonrenewal or revocation of registration.--
- 28 The department shall refuse to issue or renew a registration
- 29 certificate or shall revoke a registration certificate if the
- 30 family day-care home provider, an employee of the provider or

- 1 individual 18 years of age or older who has resided in the home
- 2 for 30 days in a calendar year:
- 3 (1) Is named in the Statewide central register of child
- 4 abuse established under 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to child
- 5 protective services) as the perpetrator of an indicated or A <—
- founded report of child abuse committed within the
- 7 immediately preceding five-year period.
- 8 (2) Is named in an indicated or AS THE PERPETRATOR OF A <-
- 9 founded report for a school employee, as defined in 23
- 10 Pa.C.S. § 6303 (relating to definitions), committed within
- 11 the immediately preceding five-year period.
- 12 (3) Has been convicted of an offense set forth in 23
- 13 Pa.C.S. § 6344(c).
- 14 Section 5. Other child-care personnel.
- 15 (a) Criminal and child abuse history information. -- The
- 16 department shall require to be submitted to the department
- 17 criminal and child abuse history information as set forth in 23
- 18 Pa.C.S. § 6344(b) (relating to information relating to
- 19 prospective child-care personnel) for the following individuals:
- 20 (1) Any individual who directly provides child-care
- 21 services which are subsidized by Federal or Commonwealth
- funds but who is not otherwise subject to approval,
- 23 SUPERVISION or licensure under Article IX or X of the act of
- June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare
- 25 Code.
- 26 (2) Any individual 18 years of age or older who resides
- in the home of an individual under paragraph (1) for at least
- 30 days in a calendar year.
- 29 (b) Use of funds.--The department shall refuse to authorize
- 30 the use of Federal or Commonwealth funds to individuals who are

- 1 not otherwise required to be licensed or registered by the
- 2 department to provide child-care services if the department
- 3 finds that an individual listed in subsection (a)(1) or (2):
- 4 (1) Is named in the Statewide central register of child
- 5 abuse as the perpetrator of an indicated or A founded report <---
- of child abuse committed within the immediately preceding
- 7 five-year period.
- 8 (2) Is named in an indicated or AS THE PERPETRATOR OF A <-
- 9 founded report for school employee, as defined in 23 Pa.C.S.
- 10 § 6303 (relating to definitions), committed within the
- immediately preceding five-year period.
- 12 (3) Has been convicted of an offense set forth in 23
- 13 Pa.C.S. § 6344(c).
- 14 Section 6. Effective date.
- 15 This act shall take effect as follows:
- 16 (1) Section 3 and this section shall take effect
- immediately.
- 18 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- 19 days.
