AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further providing for prohibition on expenditures
3 for emission inspection program.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 4706 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
8 § 4706. Prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection
9 program.

11 (c.1) Exchange of evidence of emission inspection.--A person
12 replacing a windshield or repairing a windshield in such a
13 manner as to require removal of evidence of emission inspection
14 shall at the option of the registrant of the vehicle or the
15 owner of a mass transit vehicle cut out the portion of the
16 windshield containing the evidence of emission inspection and
17 deliver it to the registrant of the vehicle or the owner of the

1 mass transit vehicle or destroy the evidence of emission
2 inspection. The vehicle or the mass transit vehicle may be
3 driven for up to five days if it displays the portion of the old
4 windshield containing the evidence of emission inspection as
5 prescribed in department regulations. Within the five-day period
6 an official emission inspection station may affix to the vehicle
7 or mass transit vehicle another evidence of emission inspection
8 for the same inspection period without reinspecting the vehicle
9 or mass transit vehicle in exchange for the portion of the old
10 windshield containing the evidence of emission inspection. A fee
11 of no more than \$2 plus the fee paid to access the department's
12 computer to enter the evidence of emission inspection into the
13 system may be charged for exchanging evidence of emission
14 inspection.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
