## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the disclosure to patients by practitioners of the
- 2 healing arts of the types of health insurance payments
- 3 accepted, for enforcement and for a civil penalty.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 8 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Licensing boards." The following boards:
- 11 (1) State Board of Chiropractic.
- 12 (2) State Board of Dentistry.
- 13 (3) State Board of Medicine.
- 14 (4) State Board of Optometry.
- 15 (5) State Board of Osteopathic Medicine.
- 16 (6) State Board of Pharmacy.
- 17 (7) State Board of Podiatry.
- 18 Section 2. Posting of notice.

- 1 A practitioner of the healing arts governed by any of the
- 2 licensing boards shall post in a conspicuous location in the
- 3 waiting rooms or at the reception area the types of health
- 4 insurance the practitioner accepts as payment, minus any
- 5 deductibles or other fees or requirements within the insurance
- 6 coverage, and any health maintenance organization that has the
- 7 practitioner as a participant.
- 8 Section 3. Enforcement.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- This act shall be enforced by the
- 10 licensing boards. Each licensing board shall notify its
- 11 respective practitioner of the provisions of this act.
- 12 (b) Civil penalty.--A practitioner who violates section 2
- 13 may be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed \$100, upon a
- 14 determination of the same by the licensing board. A practitioner
- 15 shall be given an opportunity for a hearing on the proposed
- 16 penalty. Hearings and appeals shall be conducted in the manner
- 17 provided in 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law and
- 18 procedure).
- 19 Section 4. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
