A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and distinguished naval career of Charles
- 2 "Pete" Conrad, native of this Commonwealth and one of this
- nation's distinguished astronauts, on the occasion of his
- 4 death on July 8, 1999.
- 5 WHEREAS, Charles "Pete" Conrad, Jr., was born on June 2,
- 6 1930, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad attended primary and secondary
- 8 schools at Haverford School in Haverford, Pennsylvania; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad entered the United States Navy after
- 10 graduating from Princeton University and became a naval aviator;
- 11 and

- 1 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad was selected as an astronaut by NASA
- 2 in September 1962; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad served as a pilot on the eight-day
- 4 Gemini V flight in August 1965, which flight at 190 hours and 56
- 5 minutes broke the endurance record for the number of hours in
- 6 space; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad was spacecraft commander of the
- 8 Apollo 12 mission from November 14 through 24, 1969, which
- 9 mission was the first precision lunar landing and humankind's
- 10 second lunar landing; and
- 11 WHEREAS, On that flight, Charles Conrad spent 7 hours and 45
- 12 minutes on the lunar surface and became the third person to walk
- 13 on the moon; and
- 14 WHEREAS, As spacecraft commander on his fourth flight,
- 15 Charles Conrad flew the first Skylab mission between May 25 and
- 16 June 22, 1973; and
- WHEREAS, Each member of the crew logged 672 hours and 49
- 18 minutes aboard Skylab and in so doing established a new world
- 19 record for a single mission, with Charles Conrad capturing the
- 20 individual endurance record for time in space by bringing his
- 21 total space flight time to 1,179 hours and 38 minutes; and
- 22 WHEREAS, In December 1973, after serving 20 years (11 of
- 23 which were as an astronaut in the space program), Charles Conrad
- 24 retired from the Navy in order to become a vice president with
- 25 the American Television and Communications Corporation; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Among his many honors, Charles Conrad was awarded
- 27 the Congressional Space Medal of Honor in October 1978; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Charles Conrad died on July 8, 1999, at 69 years of
- 29 age, in a motorcycle accident in California; therefore be it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the life

- 1 and distinguished naval career of Charles "Pete" Conrad, native
- 2 of this Commonwealth and one of this nation's distinguished
- 3 astronauts, on the occasion of his death on July 8, 1999.
