## A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of October 24 through 30, 1999, as "Polycystic Kidney Disease Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Polycystic kidney disease (PKD) is a genetic disease
4	that causes fluid-filled cysts to grow in the kidneys; and
5	WHEREAS, Complications of PKD include loss of kidney
6	function, swelling of the blood vessels in the brain, heart
7	problems, infections, pain, kidney stones, hernias and
8	diverticulitis; and
9	WHEREAS, PKD is the third leading cause of kidney failure and
10	is the number one hereditary disease, affecting more than
11	600,000 people in the United States; and
12	WHEREAS, PKD affects men and women and children of all races
13	and ethnic backgrounds; and
14	WHEREAS, PKD costs the taxpayers of the United States in

1 excess of \$1 billion annually in charges for dialysis, 2 transplantation and related therapies; and WHEREAS, There is no known cure for PKD; therefore be it 3 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 5 week of October 24 through 30, 1999, as "Polycystic Kidney 6 Disease Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
