12 ~~be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2000.~~

13 ~~Section 102. Definitions. The following words and phrases~~

1 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
2 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
3 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
4 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
5 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
6 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
7 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
8 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
9 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
10 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
11 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
12 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
13 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
14 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
15 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
16 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
17 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution
18 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
19 medical assistance program.

28 ~~(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. The Small~~
29 ~~Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small~~
30 ~~cities and communities that have a high concentration of~~

~~impo~~verished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
~~low income and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet~~
~~community development needs.~~

~~(c) Community Services Block Grant. The Community Services~~
~~Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and~~
~~activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on~~
~~the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the~~
~~community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In~~
~~addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old~~
~~and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements~~
~~for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to~~
~~assure proper consideration of each recipient.~~

~~(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. The~~
~~Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is~~
~~for the provision of preventive health and other health services~~
~~related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,~~
~~comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health~~
~~education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic~~
~~violence services.~~

~~(e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. The~~
~~Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to~~
~~enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in~~
~~planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for~~
~~pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with~~
~~special health care needs, and in providing health services for~~
~~mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health~~
~~care.~~

~~(f) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. The Low~~
~~Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help~~
~~lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low income~~

1 ~~families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for~~
2 ~~low income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds~~
3 ~~received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds~~
4 ~~received pursuant to a Presidential release of weather related~~
5 ~~contingency funds shall be exempt from the 15% requirement if~~
6 ~~the weather emergency has an impact in Pennsylvania. Unexpended~~
7 ~~weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being~~
8 ~~returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services~~
9 ~~may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the~~
10 ~~Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall~~

22 ~~serious emotional disturbance.~~

23 ~~(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant. The Substance Abuse Block~~
24 ~~Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs~~
25 ~~to combat alcohol and drug abuse.~~
