6	SECTION 2101. EFFECTIVE DATE.					
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania					
8	hereby enacts as follows:

11	Section 101. Short title. This act shall be known and may					
12	be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2000.					
13	Section 102. Definitions. The following words and phrases					
14	when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in					
15	this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:					
16	"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau					
17	or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant					
18	superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,					
19	engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,					
20	auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,					
21	marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and					
22	other assistants in any department, board or commission.					
23	"Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding					
24	and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,					
25	traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and					
26	repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and					
27	telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and					
28	notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,					
29	light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,					
30	repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and					
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facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 1 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of 2 3 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 4 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 5 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 6 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation 7 8 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 9 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 10 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 11 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 12 13 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 14 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 15 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 16 17 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution 18 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 19 medical assistance program. 20 Section 103. - 22 Section 104. State appropriations. The following sums set
- 23 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are
- 24 hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the
- 25 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative
- 26 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of
- 27 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the
- 28 duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the
- 29 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services
- 30 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services,

printing, public advertising by or through any medium, 1 equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other 2 3 expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the 4 proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for 5 the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for the payment of bills incurred and 6 7 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 8 $\frac{2000}{2000}$

9 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. The 10 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this 11 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 12 13 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 14 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 15 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for the payment of 16 17 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 18 year ending June 30, 2000. Unless otherwise stated, the 19 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 20 year. 21 Section 106. Block grants. (a) Appropriation. The 22 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 23 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 24 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies 25 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the 26 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000. 27 28 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. The Small 29 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small 30 cities and communities that have a high concentration of

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1 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
2 low income and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet
3 community development needs.

4 (c) Community Services Block Grant. The Community Services 5 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 6 7 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 8 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 9 10 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 11 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to assure proper consideration of each recipient. 12

13 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. The 14 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is 15 for the provision of preventive health and other health services 16 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants, 17 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health 18 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic 19 violence services.

20 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. The 21 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 22 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 23 24 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 25 special health care needs, and in providing health services for mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 26 27 care.

28 (f) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. The Low
29 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
30 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low income
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families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for 1 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 2 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 3 4 received pursuant to a Presidential release of weather related 5 contingency funds shall be exempt from the 15% requirement if the weather emergency has an impact in Pennsylvania. Unexpended 6 weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being 7 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services 8 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the 9 10 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall 11 notify the chairman and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and the 12 13 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House 14 of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such funds 15 ten days prior to any reallocation. 16 (q) Social Services Block Grant. The Social Services Block 17 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible 18 persons. 19 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant. The Mental Health 20 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of services to adults with serious mental illness or children with 21 22 serious emotional disturbance. 23 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant. The Substance Abuse Block Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs 24 25 to combat alcohol and drug abuse. 26 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant. The Child 27 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the availability 28 of child care for low-income families. 29 30 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.
