AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, further providing for securing loads on vehicles;
- and requiring certain loads to be covered.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4903(a) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 4903. Securing loads in vehicles.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- No vehicle shall be driven or moved on
- 10 any highway unless the vehicle is so constructed or loaded as to
- 11 prevent any part of its load from dropping, sifting, leaking or
- 12 otherwise escaping. Loads susceptible to scattering, including,
- 13 but not limited to, solid waste, sand, gravel, rocks, stones,
- 14 topsoil, culm and similar material, shall be subject to the
- 15 following requirements:
- 16 (1) The load shall be fully enclosed on all sides,
- including the front and rear, and shall not extend above the
- 18 uppermost edge of the front, side or rear of the vehicle.

- 1 (2) If the load extends above a horizontal line six
- 2 <u>inches below the uppermost edge of the front, side or rear of</u>
- 3 the vehicle, the load shall be securely covered with a
- 4 <u>tarpaulin or other suitable cover.</u>
- 5 (3) Openings used to empty the load, including, but not
- 6 <u>limited to, bottom dump gates and tailgates, shall have</u>
- 7 properly working seals.
- 8 This section shall not prevent the department and local
- 9 <u>authorities from spreading sand, salt and other antiskid</u>
- 10 materials on the highway for the purpose of improving traction,
- 11 nor from spraying water or other substances for the purpose of
- 12 <u>cleaning or maintaining the highway.</u>
- 13 * * *
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
