AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- 5 laws relating thereto, requiring reports of incidents of
- 6 school violence to local law enforcement agencies.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1318.1. Mandatory Reporting of Acts of Violence to
- 13 Local Law Enforcement. -- Every principal in charge of a public
- 14 school shall immediately report to the local law enforcement
- 15 agency with jurisdiction over that public school the commission
- 16 of an act of violence by a pupil. The procedures for reporting
- 17 acts of violence shall be in compliance with the procedures set
- 18 forth in the school entity's memorandum of understanding with

- 1 the local law enforcement agency as required in section 1303-
- 2 A(c) of this act. For the purposes of this section, acts of
- 3 violence shall include:
- 4 (1) Possession of a weapon on school property.
- 5 (2) Possession of an offensive weapon.
- 6 (3) Possession of an instrument of crime.
- 7 (4) Possession of a firearm on school property.
- 8 (5) Aggravated assault.
- 9 <u>(6) Terroristic threats.</u>
- 10 <u>(7) Harassment.</u>
- 11 <u>(8) Stalking.</u>
- 12 (9) Criminal homicide.
- 13 <u>(10) Rape.</u>
- 14 (11) Arson.
- 15 <u>(12) Kidnapping.</u>
- 16 <u>(13)</u> Robbery.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
