L5	WHEREAS, The number of registered voters in this Commonwealth
L6	has increased while the number of people voting in elections
L7	continues to decrease; and
L8	WHEREAS, This decrease may be due to, among other things,
L9	negative attitudes resulting from longer campaign seasons and
20	negative campaigning; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The six-month period between the primary in the
- 2 spring and the general election in November necessitates the
- 3 raising of more money for campaigning than would a two-month
- 4 period and thus increases the influence of money on the
- 5 political process; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 7 General Assembly direct the Joint State Government Commission to
- 8 create a bipartisan task force consisting of two members
- 9 appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate, two
- 10 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, two
- 11 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 12 and two members appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
- 13 Representatives; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the task force create an advisory committee
- 15 composed of one representative from, and designated by, each of
- 16 the following: the Bureau of Election of the Department of
- 17 State, the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania, the
- 18 Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania
- 19 State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania
- 20 State Association of Township Supervisors and the Pennsylvania
- 21 League of Cities and Municipalities and such additional members
- 22 as the task force shall deem appropriate; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the task force shall study the feasibility of
- 24 changing general primary elections and municipal primary
- 25 elections to September, along with the question of the timing of
- 26 the presidential primaries and the possibility of separating the
- 27 presidential primary from the primary for nominations to other
- 28 public offices which study shall analyze and estimate the costs
- 29 to the State and county governments to make the change, as well
- 30 as the impact such a change could have on reducing election

- campaigning and campaign finance costs; and be it further 1
- 2 RESOLVED, That the [Joint State Government Commission] task
- 3 <u>force</u> report its findings, recommendations and proposed
- 4 legislation to the General Assembly no later than September 1,
- 5 [1999] <u>2000</u>.
