## AN ACT

- Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699),
- entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice 3
  - of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of
- 4 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising,
- consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," 5
- providing for regulation of pharmacy technicians. 6
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699),
- known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by adding a section to 10
- 11 read:
- 12 Section 3.3. Pharmacy Technicians .-- (a) A person qualified
- 13 and practicing as a pharmacy technician shall register annually
- 14 with the board, in a manner provided by the board. At a minimum,
- an individual is eliqible for registration as a pharmacy 15
- technician if the individual has successfully completed a 16
- nationally recognized pharmacy technician certification 17

- 1 <u>examination</u>.
- (b) The board may develop and promulgate rules and 2
- 3 regulations relating to:
- 4 (1) Registration requirements for pharmacy technicians,
- including certification standards and curriculum requirements. 5
- 6 (2) Minimum pharmacy technician-to-pharmacist ratios.
- 7 (3) Pharmacy technician registration fees.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 8
