AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto, providing for integrated pesticide
- 6 PEST management programs in schools.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 772.1. Integrated Pesticide PEST Management</u>

- 1 Programs. -- (a) The following apply to pesticide applicators:
- 2 (1) For a pesticide treatment at a school building, the
- 3 <u>certified applicator or pesticide application technician shall</u>
- 4 supply the pest control information sheet and a pest control
- 5 sign, which must be at least eight and one-half by eleven (8 1/2
- 6 by 11) inches in size, to the chief administrator or building
- 7 manager.
- 8 (2) For a pesticide treatment on school grounds, including
- 9 athletic fields and playgrounds, the certified applicator or
- 10 pesticide application technician shall supply the pest control
- 11 <u>information sheet and a pest control sign, which must be at</u>
- 12 <u>least eight and one-half by eleven (8 1/2 by 11) inches in size,</u>
- 13 to the chief administrator or grounds manager.
- (b) Responsibilities of schools are as follows:
- (1) Each public school district shall, by July 1, 2002,
- 16 adopt an integrated pest management plan in accordance with the
- 17 integrated pest management policies established by the
- 18 department on the effective date of this section, until
- 19 regulations are promulgated by the department.
- 20 (2) Except as provided in clause (4), notification of
- 21 <u>pesticide treatments shall be as follows:</u>
- 22 (i) For a pesticide treatment at a school building, the
- 23 school shall be responsible for all of the following:
- 24 (A) Posting the pest control sign received under subsection
- 25 (a)(1) in an area of common access where individuals are likely
- 26 to view the sign on a regular basis at least seventy-two (72)
- 27 hours before and for at least two (2) days following each
- 28 planned treatment.
- 29 (B) Providing the pest control information sheet received
- 30 under subsection (a)(1) to every individual working in the

- 1 school building at least seventy-two (72) hours before each
- 2 planned treatment.
- 3 (C) Providing notice, including the name, address and
- 4 telephone number of the applicator providing the treatment, day
- 5 of treatment and pesticide to be utilized, to the parents or
- 6 guardians of students enrolled in the school at least seventy-
- 7 two (72) hours before each planned treatment as follows:
- 8 (I) notice to all parents or guardians utilizing normal
- 9 school communications procedures; or
- 10 (II) notice to a list of interested parents or quardians
- 11 who, at the beginning of each school year, or upon the child's
- 12 <u>enrollment</u>, requested notification of individual application of
- 13 pesticides. The school shall provide procedures or materials for
- 14 such requests to parents and quardians of students. Notification
- 15 of each pesticide application shall be provided using first
- 16 <u>class mail or other means deemed appropriate by the school to</u>
- 17 <u>each parent or guardian requesting notification.</u>
- 18 (ii) For a pesticide treatment on school grounds, the school
- 19 shall be responsible for all of the following:
- 20 (A) Posting the pest control sign received under subsection
- 21 (a)(2) at the place to be treated at least seventy-two (72)
- 22 hours before and for two (2) days after the planned treatment.
- 23 (B) Providing the pest control information sheet received
- 24 under subsection (a)(2) to every individual working in the
- 25 school building at least seventy-two (72) hours before each
- 26 planned treatment.
- 27 (C) Providing notice, including the name, address and
- 28 telephone number of the applicator providing the treatment, day
- 29 of treatment and pesticide to be utilized, to the parents or
- 30 quardians of students enrolled in the school at least seventy-

- 1 two (72) hours before each planned treatment as follows:
- 2 (I) notice to all parents or quardians utilizing normal
- 3 <u>school communications procedures; or</u>
- 4 (II) notice to a list of interested parents or quardians
- 5 who, at the beginning of each school year, or upon the child's
- 6 enrollment, requested notification of individual application of
- 7 pesticides. The school shall provide procedures or materials for
- 8 <u>such requests to parents and quardians of students.</u> Notification
- 9 of each pesticide application shall be provided using first
- 10 class mail or other means deemed appropriate by the school to
- 11 <u>each parent or guardian requesting notification.</u>
- 12 (iii) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
- 13 where pests pose an immediate threat to the health and safety of
- 14 students or employes, the school may authorize an emergency
- 15 pesticide application. In the case of an emergency pesticide
- 16 application, the school shall notify by telephone any parent or
- 17 quardian who has requested such notification. School officials
- 18 shall annually advise parents of their right to request
- 19 notification of emergency pesticide use and shall explain
- 20 <u>procedures for requesting such notification</u>.
- 21 (3) Except as provided in clause (4), each school shall
- 22 maintain detailed records of all chemical pest control
- 23 treatments for a period of at least three (3) years.
- 24 (4) The notice and recordkeeping requirements in clauses (2)
- 25 and (3) and subsection (c) do not apply to the application of:
- 26 (i) disinfectant and antimicrobial products;
- 27 (ii) self-containerized baits placed in areas not accessible
- 28 to students and gel type baits placed in cracks, crevices or
- 29 voids; or
- 30 (iii) swimming pool maintenance chemicals in the care and

- 1 maintenance of a swimming pool.
- 2 (c) The following prohibitions shall apply:
- 3 (1) Except as provided in clause (2), pesticides may not be
- 4 applied within a school building where students are expected to
- 5 be present for normal academic instruction or organized
- 6 <u>extracurricular activities within seven (7) hours following the</u>
- 7 application, or on school grounds where students will be in the
- 8 immediate vicinity for normal academic instruction or organized
- 9 <u>extracurricular activities within seven (7) hours following the</u>
- 10 application. The applicator shall also comply with re-entry time
- 11 <u>restrictions contained on the pesticide label.</u>
- 12 (2) Students may not be present in an untreated portion of
- 13 the school building unless the area being treated has a separate
- 14 ventilation system and is separated from the untreated portion
- 15 by smoke or fire doors, or is a separate building.
- 16 (d) The department shall do all of the following:
- 17 (1) Maintain a hypersensitivity registry to assist in the
- 18 notification of students and employes who are especially
- 19 sensitive to pesticides.
- 20 (2) Designate an integrated pest management coordinator
- 21 within the department to assist schools in the adoption and
- 22 administration of integrated pest management plans.
- 23 (3) Prepare a standard structural integrated pest management
- 24 agreement and distribute the standard agreement to schools.
- 25 (4) Provide other materials and assistance to school
- 26 districts to aid schools and school districts in developing
- 27 integrated pest management plans.
- 28 (5) Promulgate regulations, consistent with its policies in
- 29 effect on the date of this section, to assist schools in
- 30 <u>implementing their responsibilities under this section.</u>

- 1 (e) The following words and phrases when used in this
- 2 <u>section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection</u>
- 3 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 4 <u>"Applicator." A certified applicator, commercial applicator</u>
- 5 <u>or public applicator.</u>
- 6 <u>"Certified applicator."</u> An individual who is certified under
- 7 section 16.1, 17 or 17.1 of the act of March 1, 1974 (P.L.90,
- 8 No.24), known as the "Pennsylvania Pesticide Control Act of
- 9 1973, as competent to use or supervise the use or application
- 10 of any pesticide.
- 11 <u>"Commercial applicator." A certified applicator, whether or</u>
- 12 not he is a private applicator with respect to some uses, who
- 13 uses or supervises the use of any pesticide on the property or
- 14 premises of another or on easements granted under State law, or
- 15 any applicator who uses or supervises the use of any restricted-
- 16 use pesticide on property owned or rented by him or his
- 17 employer, when not for purposes of producing an agricultural
- 18 product. The secretary may by regulation deem certain types of
- 19 applicators using any pesticide on their own property or that of
- 20 <u>their employer as commercial applicators.</u>
- 21 <u>"Department." The Department of Agriculture of the</u>
- 22 Commonwealth.
- 23 "Insect." Any of the numerous small invertebrate animals
- 24 generally having a more or less obviously segmented body, for
- 25 the most part belonging to the class Insecta, comprising six-
- 26 <u>legged</u>, usually winged forms, as, for example, beetles, bugs,
- 27 bees and flies, and to other allied classes of arthropods whose
- 28 members are wingless and usually have more than six (6) legs,
- 29 as, for example, spiders, mites, ticks, centipedes and wood
- 30 lice.

- 1 "Integrated pest management plan." A plan which establishes
- 2 <u>a sustainable approach to managing pests by combining</u>
- 3 biological, cultural, physical and chemical tools in a way which
- 4 minimizes economic, health and environmental risks.
- 5 "Nematode." An invertebrate animal of the phylum
- 6 Nemathelminthes and class Nematoda, that is, unsegmented round
- 7 worms with elongated, fusiform or sac-like bodies covered with
- 8 cuticle and inhabiting soil, water, plants or plant parts. The
- 9 <u>term includes nemas and eelworms</u>.
- 10 <u>"Person." An individual, partnership, association,</u>
- 11 corporation or any organized group of persons, whether
- 12 <u>incorporated or not.</u>
- 13 "Pest." An insect, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed or other
- 14 form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or animal life or virus,
- 15 <u>bacteria or other micro-organism, except viruses, bacteria or</u>
- 16 other micro-organisms on or in living man or other living
- 17 <u>animals</u>, <u>declared to be a pest under section 25(c)(1) of the</u>
- 18 Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (61 Stat.
- 19 163, 7 U.S.C. § 136w).
- 20 "Pest control information sheet." A document which contains
- 21 the date of treatment, the name, address and telephone number of
- 22 the applicator, the pesticide utilized and any other information
- 23 that is required by the Secretary of Agriculture.
- 24 <u>"Pesticide." A substance or mixture of substances intended</u>
- 25 for preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating a pest and a
- 26 substance or mixture of substances intended for use as a plant
- 27 regulator, defoliant or desiccant.
- 28 <u>"Pesticide application technician." An individual employed</u>
- 29 by a commercial applicator or governmental agency who, having
- 30 met the competency requirements as set forth in the act of March

- 1 1, 1974 (P.L.90, No.24), known as the "Pennsylvania Pesticide"
- 2 Control Act of 1973," is registered by the Secretary of
- 3 Agriculture to apply pesticides under the direct supervision of
- 4 <u>a certified applicator</u>.
- 5 <u>"Public applicator." A certified applicator who applies</u>
- 6 pesticides as an employe of the Commonwealth or its
- 7 <u>instrumentalities or a local agency.</u>
- 8 <u>"School." A school district, an intermediate unit or an area</u>
- 9 <u>vocational-technical school or any of these entities acting</u>
- 10 jointly.
- 11 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of Agriculture of the</u>
- 12 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
