AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, prohibiting hunting in and around game feeders and
- 3 game feeding areas.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 2308(a)(8) of Title 34 of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended December 20, 2000
- 8 (P.L.783, No.111), is amended and the section is amended by
- 9 adding a subsection to read:
- 10 § 2308. Unlawful devices and methods.
- 11 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided in this
- 12 title, it is unlawful for any person to hunt or aid, abet,
- 13 assist or conspire to hunt any game or wildlife through the use
- 14 of:
- 15 * * *
- 16 (8) Any artificial or natural bait, hay, grain, fruit,
- 17 nut, salt, chemical, mineral or other food as an enticement
- 18 for game or wildlife, regardless of kind and quantity, or

- 1 take advantage of any such area or food or bait prior to 30
- 2 days after the removal of such material and its residue.
- Nothing contained in this [subsection] paragraph shall
- 4 pertain to normal or accepted farming, habitat management
- 5 practices, oil and gas drilling, mining, forest management
- 6 activities or other legitimate commercial or industrial
- 7 practices. Upon discovery of such baited areas, whether
- 8 prosecution is contemplated or not, the commission may cause
- 9 a reasonable area surrounding the enticement to be posted
- against hunting or taking game or wildlife. The posters shall
- 11 remain for 30 days after complete removal of the bait.
- 12 * * *
- 13 (a.1) Game feeders and feeding areas.--
- 14 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, it shall
- be unlawful for any person to hunt any game or wildlife
- within 100 yards of any game feeder or feeding areas where
- 17 any natural hay, grass, browse, grain, fruit, nut, salt,
- 18 chemical, mineral, other food or any combination thereof is
- 19 <u>used for feeding purposes.</u>
- 20 (2) Any violation of this subsection must require proof
- 21 <u>that the alleged violator knew or should have known of the</u>
- 22 presence of the game feeder or feeding area.
- 23 (3) Movement through a feeding area or past a feeder to
- 24 <u>an area outside of the parameters of paragraph (1) shall not</u>
- be construed as an illegal hunting activity.
- 26 (4) Nothing contained in this subsection shall pertain
- to normal or accepted farming, habitat management practices,
- 28 <u>oil and gas drilling, mining, forest management activities or</u>
- 29 other legitimate commercial or industrial practices.
